## Training Makes it Easy

We just finished our 5th CERT class at the Ocean Pines Fire Department. I was asked if there are any professional certifications available to CERT personnel. Yes, there are, and they are all available through online classes. These certificates can carry over to any resume and they will look good. Here's what you can do:

1. Go to the Emergency Management Institute's website at <https://training.fema.gov/is/crslist.aspx>.
2. Click on “Curriculum” in the menu on the left of the page.
3. In the center, click on “Professional Development.”
4. There in front of you are the 7 Independent Study/on-line classes to take for the Professional Development Certificate.

There is no timeline to complete these courses once you start. After all 7 courses have been completed, FEMA will send you a

very nice Professional Development Certificate.

Two other IS courses, IS-315 and IS-317, are CERT specific and should be used as a supplement along with the CERT class.

Before you start, you need to acquire a FEMA SID number. There is a link at the top of each page under “Apply,” or you can go directly to the Student Identification System page at <https://cdp.dhs.gov/femasid>.

## CERT ID Cards

If any current or past CERT personnel would like an ID card with your picture on it, make an appointment with me. Having the ID card could prove useful in identifying yourself should you roll up on an accident scene or be asked to help out with an event.

## RACES

The Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Services (RACES) is a standby radio service provided for in FCC regulations to be used when all other modes of communication are compromised, or in times of emergency. When activated, the only allowed users will be amateur radio operators who are registered with state and local governments.

If anybody is interested in RACES participation, shoot me an email or call and I'll steer you in the right direction. Presently the local RACES meet once each month either in the Ocean City Public Safety Building or the Fire Training Center in Newark.



## Volunteering

If anyone wants to volunteer with a specific organization such as CERT Ocean City or Worcester County, Red Cross, Mission Continues, Habitat for Humanity, Team Rubicon, etc., it can be arranged. I know that our time management is critical sometimes and volunteering may not be our priority due to work and family. If it is something in the back of your mind, perhaps we can do some training in preparation for our volunteering journey when it comes. Remember, we can usually offer any training that you are interested in as long as we have several interested in that topic. Examples of what we have offered in the past are, sheltering, K-9 safety, incident command, land navigation, and traffic incident management safety.

We, Worcester County, are fortunate that we have a Volunteer Services Coordinator who can arrange the meeting with your group of interest. Although our events in Worcester County are not as numerous as Ocean City, we do have a seamless working relationship and try to help each other out when assistance is needed. Contact information for Volunteer Services Coordinator is on the county

website and she is located within Human Resources Department.

On the horizon, we will be offering a Communications class to assist the 911 dispatchers when our EOC is activated. These individuals will be seated in our EOC and will answer the non-emergency telephones and direct the caller to the proper agency to assist them with concerns such as downed trees, flooding, lost animals, sheltering, and other concerns. This class will be offered in June and I will send out an email when the date has been set.

Ocean City is scheduling a CERT class starting September 28th. We may offer one in October if the interest is there.
