

**WORCESTER COUNTY ELECTRICAL BOARD
MEETING MINUTES**

March 13, 2018

The Worcester County Electrical Board met on Tuesday, March 13, 2018 in the meeting room of the Isle of Wight County Office Building, 13070 St. Martin's Neck Road, Bishopville, Maryland. Members present were Chairman Kenneth Lambertson Sr., Michael Patchett, Carl Smith, Duane Duncan, Roy Case, Jeffrey Novak and Steve Kolarik, Members. Also in attendance were Deborah Mooney, License Permit Clerk II, and County Attorney Maureen Howarth.

The meeting was called to order by Kenneth Lambertson, Sr., Chairman, at 3:10P.M.

The minutes of the last meeting held on February 13, 2018 and the agenda for this meeting were reviewed. A motion was made by Mike Patchett, and Duane Duncan seconded the motion, and unanimously carried to approve the minutes, as presented.

The following is the Treasurer's Report to be included in the minutes:

The Treasurer's Report for February: the Department issued (67) electrical permits, total revenue collected for electrical permits was \$1675.00 and \$3030.00 for electrical licenses. There were (7) new master electrician license issued for Anthony Oliveri, Donald Cherry, Ronald Osti-Helsley, Angel Vicarromero, Kenneth Babineau, William Outten and Frederick Stumpf all of them reciprocated with the State of Maryland. There were (2) new electrician limited license issued to Richard DeMass who reciprocated with Anne Arundel County and Stephen Janis who reciprocated with Baltimore county. Total revenue for February was \$4705.00.

The Board continued their discussion on eliminating electrician's assistants. Jeffrey Novak motioned to eliminate the electrician assistants there was no second on the motion. Next, Mike Patchett motioned to keep assistants as it is now, there was no second on that motion either. Therefore, the discussion on eliminating electrician assistants becomes a dead issue.

Next the Board reviewed application for Robert Powell Jr., for an Electrician Limited license. Jeffrey Novak motion to approve the application and Roy Case seconded the motion and unanimously carried to approve the application.

Next the Board reviewed the application for Paul Hudson to take the Electrician General exam. After reviewing the application it appears Mr. Hudson has not worked under a master electrician or an electrician general in the preceding four consecutive years as required to take the exam, therefore does not meet the qualifications per code BR 2-202 in the Worcester County Electrical Code. Mike Patchett motioned to deny the application and Duane Duncan seconded the motion and unanimously carried to deny the application. The Board will send a letter to inform Mr. Hudson of the decision with explanation.

There being no further business Steve Kolarik motioned to adjourn the meeting and Carl Smith seconded the motion and unanimously carried to adjourn the meeting 3:31P.M.
