

**WORCESTER COUNTY ELECTRICAL BOARD  
MEETING MINUTES  
October 9, 2018**

The Worcester County Electrical Board met on Tuesday October 9, 2018 in the meeting room of the Isle of Wight County Office Building, 13070 St. Martin's Neck Road, Bishopville, Maryland. Members present were Chairman Kenneth Lambertson Sr., Carl Smith, Duane Duncan, Michael Patchett, Steve Kolarik, Jeffrey Novak and Roy Case Members. Also in attendance were Deborah Mooney, License Permit Clerk II and Maureen Howath, County attorney.

The meeting was called to order by Kenneth Lambertson, Sr., Chairman, at 3:10P.M.

The minutes of the last meeting held on September 11, 2018 and the agenda for this meeting were reviewed. A motion was made by Duane Duncan and Steve Kolarik seconded the motion, and unanimously carried to approve the minutes, as presented.

The following is the Treasurer's Report to be included in the minutes:

The Treasurer's Report for September: the Department issued (37) electrical permits, total revenue collected for electrical permits was \$900.00 and \$460.00 for electrical licenses. There were (4) new master electrician license issued to Steven Dallis, Jefferson Betmarik, Ralph Almaraz and Paul Clapp Jr., all of them reciprocated with the State of Maryland. John Dize Jr. was approved for an electrician general license by reciprocation with Wicomico County. Total revenue for May was \$1360.00.

Next, the board reviewed the application of Joe Dell to take the electrician general exam. Mr. Dell was present and discussed with the board his experience. He taught High School courses on small motors and electricity in Pennsylvania. Mr. Lambertson went over the code qualifications required in order to take the electrician general's exam. Unfortunately, Mr. Dell does not meet the qualifications, lacking supervised experience under a licensed electrician. Mr. Lambertson explained to Mr. Dell he would need to work under a master or general electrician for 4 years as an apprentice. At that point he then would be able to take the exam.

Next, item of business was discussing to request that the original qualifications for an inspector be put back in the county code. The board is not sure how it ever got out of the code but it should be put back. Maureen will discuss the matter with Ed Tudor so he can draft the request and present it to the board at the next meeting. Then the Board can proceed with getting the draft before the Commissioners to have the requirements reinstated.

Trey Stokely inquired about getting his master's license with Worcester County. Mr. Stokely, still being an assistant on his father's electrician general license, wanted to continue to be able to pull permits under his father's license. He wanted to use the same insurance coverage for his master license. Maureen Howath advised me to get all Trey's questions in written form in an email. The Board would then respond back to all of his questions in written form.

There being no further business Steve Kolarik motioned to adjourn the meeting and

Duane Duncan seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the meeting was adjourned at 3:53 PM.
