

**WORCESTER COUNTY ELECTRICAL BOARD**  
**MEETING MINUTES**  
**December 11, 2018**

The Worcester County Electrical Board met on Tuesday December 11, 2018 in the meeting room of the Isle of Wight County Office Building, 13070 St. Martin's Neck Road, Bishopville, Maryland. Members present were Chairman Kenneth Lambertson Sr., Carl Smith, Duane Duncan, Michael Patchett and Jeffrey Novak Members. Also in attendance was Deborah Mooney, License Permit Clerk II.

The meeting was called to order by Carl Smith, Vice Chairman, at 3:00P.M.

The minutes of the last meeting held on November 13, 2018 and the agenda for this meeting were reviewed. A motion was made by Michael Patchett and Duane Duncan seconded the motion, and unanimously carried to approve the minutes, as presented.

The following is the Treasurer's Report to be included in the minutes:

The Treasurer's Report for November: the Department issued (50) electrical permits, total revenue collected for electrical permits was \$1250.00 for electrical permits and \$360.00 for electrical licenses. There were (3) new master electricians Brandon Ksiazek, Robert S. Simmons Jr. & Michael A. Cox all reciprocated with the State of Maryland and (1) new electrician general Michael D. Jones who reciprocated with Wicomico County.

The first item of business was reviewing a complaint filed by Luther Stokely III (Trey) on Jason Danner for doing electrical work without a license. The work in question was done under a permit that was pulled by Luther Stokely Jr.- license number G 609. Mr. Stokely, III holds an assistant's card that allows him to pull permits under his father's license. Jason Danner at one point was partners with Trey Stokely but no longer is. After reviewing the complaint the Board agreed that Mr. Stokely, III. did not provide enough proof to prove his complaint and that this was more a civil matter. The board did say the permit needs to get a final. Deborah Mooney will send to the license holder Luther Stokely Jr. and his assistant Luther Stokely III (Trey) a letter and advise them of the outcome of the complaint.

Next item of business was reviewing the application of Aristides Rodriguez for an electrician general license. After reviewing the application Jeffrey Novak motioned to approve the application and Kenny Lambertson seconded the motion, and unanimously carried to approve the application.

The board reviewed the memo Ed Tudor drafted to add in to the code in order for a person to be qualified to take the inspector's exam that they must have held a master's license for at least seven years. The board members all agreed to this addition to the code.

Next the board discussed low voltage licensing and requirements. The board decided to

table that item for discussion until next meeting.

There being no further business Jeffrey Novak motioned to adjourn the meeting and Duane Duncan seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the meeting was adjourned at 4:10 PM.
