**Hearing Minutes:** The licensees along with their attorney Hugh Cropper, Esquire appeared before the Board for a Class "A" 7 Day License Violation of Alcoholic Beverages Article, Section 6-304 (Sale to a Minor). The licensees and witness were sworn in. Mr. Coates submitted (Board's Exhibit #1) Board's Investigation Report Dated: July 2, 2024, Compliance Check History, Alcohol Awareness Certified Employee List, and Worcester County Sheriff's Office (WCSO) Incident Case Report #24-0000403, into evidence regarding a violation that occurred on March 19, 2024. Mr. Coates asked Cropper did they receive this information and whether there were any corrections or changes. Cropper introduced himself to the Board stating he will be representing James Hughes, Jr. and Rachalle. L. Spicer today. Cropper stated there are no corrections or changes they are here today for mitigation. Cropper stated to the Board as you can see from the compliance check history report this establishment has had numerous compliance checks and did not sell. Cropper submitted (Licensee's Exhibit #1) Jennifer Marlo TAM certificate. Cropper stated to the Board J. Marlo was not terminated because she is a good employee but was suspended from work on the condition she could not return to work until she was TAM re-certified. Cropper asked Marlo to explain to the Board what happened the day of the incident. Marlo told the Board she was busy and when a few people approached the counter, I asked for ID and reviewed, but didn't take the time to scan the ID, I entered my date of birth (DOB) information to complete the sale. Marlo stated it was an oversight and she takes full responsibility. Commissioner Nichols asked Marlo, does the store have a POS system, and why did you enter your DOB. Marlo stated "Yes," there is a POS system, I was busy doing other things I looked at the ID and entered my DOB to process the sale quickly, this was an oversight on my part. Hughes explained to the Board how the 7-11 POS system operates, stating that when you scan an alcoholic beverage a yellow screen appears you either must scan the license or override, stating that because some IDs cannot be read by the POS system because of multiply reasons. Cpl. Bissman stated that Dep. Shavne entered the establishment and contacted the manager, Patrick Spicer. Dep. Shavne stated Marlo explained how the sale was completed, and then Spicer asked if he could scan the ID to ensure his POS system is working properly.

Moore, Esquire before the Board for a Class "B" B/W/L 7 Day License Violation of Alcoholic Beverages Article, Section 6-304 (Sale to a Minor). The licensees were sworn in. Mr. Coates submitted (Board's Exhibit #1) Board's Investigation Report Dated: August 14, 2024, Compliance Check History, Alcohol Awareness Certified Employee List, and Ocean City Police Department Office (OCPD) Incident Case Report #2024-002209, into evidence regarding a violation that occurred on June 20, 2024. Mr. Coates asked Moore did they receive this information and were there any corrections or changes. Moore introduced himself to the Board and stated he will be representing Francesco Fidanza and Kevin Decker today. Moore stated there are no corrections or changes we are here today for mitigation. Moore stated Decker is the resident agent and is not involved in the daily operations. Decker replied "Correct." Moore asked Fidanza are you the license holder of the property, and this establishment is in the Lankford Hotel which is also owned by one of your businesses. Fidanza stated "Correct." Moore stated to Fidanza you have years of experience in the sale of alcoholic beverages in the state of New York where for about 20 years you have held five alcoholic beverage licenses. Fidanza stated "Correct." Moore asked Fidanza in your 20 years in the alcoholic beverage business have any of your establishments had any violations. Fidanza stated "No." Moore asked Fidanza you were issued your license on May 23, 2024, stating that you had only been open for 28 days. Fidanza stated "Correct." Moore asked Fidanza if it is correct that you hired J1 students out of necessity because of the lack of staff. Fidanza stated "Yes." Moore asked Fidanza if you were on the property at the time of the violation. Fidanza stated "Yes," I was there overseeing the operations and training. Moore stated the employee that served the minor was not TIPS/TAM certified because he had not been employed that long. Fidanza stated "Correct," at the time of the violation the employee that served the minor was hired to be a food runner, but because we didn't have enough servers that day he started serving. Fidanza stated being he was from a foreign country he didn't understand the alcohol regulations. Fidanza stated is was also our neglections for not having our more experience servers stay with him until he was fully trained. Fidanza stated we have

purchased an iPad that will scan all IDs, at the time of the violation we did not have that in place. Moore asked Fidanza since the day of the violation, are all your servers TIPs/TAM certified. Fidanza stated "Yes," and we have the readers to scan all IDs. Sgt. Smith stated the staff was cooperative and polite. Commissioner Pusey asked who asked the J1 to serve the customers. Fidanza stated he was unsure, noting there were experienced staff members available, I'm unsure if because of the language barrier a misunderstanding of communication occurred. Commissioner Pusey asked Sgt. Kutz, was the establishment busy. Sgt. Kutz stated there was a light crowd at the time of the incident they were not that busy. Commissioner Nichols asked Fidanza during the 28 days before the violation had your staff been given any training. Mr. Coates asked the licensees did they receive this information and were there any corrections or changes. Moore introduced himself to the Board and stated he is representing Burc B. Kucuk today. Moore stated there are no corrections or changes we are here today for mitigation. Moore stated to the Board there are two additional matters he would like to inform the Board of involving this incident. Moore stated to the Board the employee that served the minor in the report states that they were employed for a month, when in fact they had only been employed for two weeks and the report also states they were TIPS/TAM certified which is not correct, the employee was not TIPS/TAM certified. Moore stated we wanted to be completely transparent to the Board. Moore asked Kucuk is it your business practice to have all your servers TIPs/TAM certified. Kucuk stated "Yes." Moore submitted (Licensee's Exhibit #1) Brother's Bistro Employee Handbook. Moore noted to the Board there are pages in the handbook that clearly instructed the employees of the strict guidelines and the consequences for serving alcoholic beverages to an underage customer. Moore submitted (Licensee's Exhibit #2) sign showing example of a vertical IDs. Moore asked Kucuk where the signs are located. Kucuk stated the signs are located where the servers pick up their orders, so they must look at them several times a shift. Kucuk stated the server was terminated because our establishment has a "No Tolerance Policy." Moore submitted (Licensee's Collective Exhibit #3) staff TIPS/TAM certificates. Moore stated to

Kucuk you have been the licensee holder of this establishment for several years and there have been several "No Sales." Commissioner Esham stated for the record there have been two "No Sales." Commissioner Esham asked Sgt. Kutz were there any issues. Sgt. Kutz stated that this is not a problem area, and the staff was polite and cooperative, he believes the server was a J1 student and many times there is a language barrier. Sgt. Kutz stated the server didn't ask for an ID when she took the order but upon returning, she did request the ID, the cadet gave the server the vertical ID after the server reviewed the ID she served the cadet. Commissioner Nichols asked Kucuk in reviewing this employee handbook I don't see any information regarding vertical IDs. Kucuk stated the handbook has not been updated since 2010. Commissioner Nichols stated "I question your establishment's training process" stating I've heard many times today about the language barrier, the J1 students come here to work, and it is the responsibility of the business owners and management to ensure they receive the proper training to do their job. Moore stated even though the handbook has not been updated to include the vertical ID information, Brother's Bistro is being proactive by posting a large sign that is in clear view for all serving staff, which is helpful for those with a language barrier.

Cropper asked Kreider was he at the establishment the day of the incident. Kreider stated "Yes," I was in the back working. Cropper asked Kreider is Williams still employed. Kreider stated "Yes," but he is no longer allowed behind the register he was kept being a shelf stocker. Hearing Minutes: The licensees along with their attorney appeared before the Board for a Class "B" B/W/L 7 Day License Violation of Alcoholic Beverages Article, Section 6-304 (Sales to Minors). The licensees and witnesses were sworn in. Mr. Coates submitted (Board's Exhibit #1) Board's Investigation Report Dated: August 8, 2024, Compliance Check History, Alcohol Awareness Certified Employee List, and Ocean City Police Department Incident Case Report #2024-002505, into evidence regarding violations that occurred on June 29, 2024. Mr. Coates asked Moore did they receive this information and were there any corrections or changes. Moore introduced himself to the Board and stated he is representing Joseph F. Zorbach and Stephen J. Carullo, Jr., today. Moore stated there are no corrections or changes we are here today for mitigation. Moore submitted (Licensee's Collective Exhibit #1) Marko Jekic alcohol certification, employee handbook excerpt, Jekic's handbook acknowledgement signature, Jekic's signed Alcohol Promissory note, letter from Jekic's sponsor company, and three slides in-class server training, servers & bartenders' certification. Moore asked Carullo WAS the server M. Jekic that served alcoholic beverages to the two underage cadets was a J1 student and is not employed with Dead Freddies. Carullo stated "Correct," Jekic was terminated and has returned to his country. Moore asked Carullo about the promissory note that the servers sign. Carullo stated this is to get any employees' attention regarding the consequences for serving any underage customers. Moore asked Carullo for the record did you collect the promissory note from Jekic. Carullo stated "No." Carullo stated we are working with the student placement agency that will enforce if a J1 student is involved in any violations their automatic deported. Moore asked Carullo how many employees does he employee during the summer season. Carullo stated he has 90 employees, which is 80 servers and 10 bartenders, stating all but three or four were TIPs/TAM certified and those employees were just hired. Carullo displayed to the Board 25 fake IDs that Dead Freddies staff has confiscated from underage patrons. Welteroth gave a demonstration to the Board of an ID scanning

system they are using at this time for checking IDs known as Intel Check which scans the back of all IDs, stating that each one of managers has this app on their phone and we have iPads at server stations. Moore asked Carullo you have strict rules and penalties in place, tell the Board the incentives you are proposing to offer to the employees. Carullo stated that he believes the best way to get the servers' attention is to offer incentive money as a bonus for paying close attention. Carullo stated he will offer each employee \$25 for each fake ID collected and \$1K each time they do not serve a cadet. Carullo stated the other step we are considering is having managers approach each table that is being served alcoholic beverages. Carullo stated to the Board I've concluded the employees serving alcohol beverages struggle with looking at the IDs and doing the math and it's even more difficult the the J1 employees, this is why I installed the scanning system at the serving stations, I have spent over 30K this year in every attempt to ensure the staff has every tool available to them to prevent anyone underage being served. Sgt. Smith stated he has no knowledge of this property being a problem, he noted that this property does have a large volume of customers. Sgt. Smith stated he is pleased to hear this establishment is taking extra steps to not only prevent serving underage patrons but also catching and confiscating fake IDs. Commissioner Pusey asked Carullo are you a certified trainer. Carullo stated "No," we use the Health Département or other TIPs/TAM training organizations, I conducted an in-house training session each month as a review to ensure the employees understand the rules and regulations of the business. Commissioner Pusey asked if all the servers have the app. Carullo stated "No," the charge is about \$2K for ten license so each manager has, and the server stations have the app on the iPad. Commissioner Nichols questioned Carullo about the promissory note, questioning does he believe the J1 students completely understand what they are signing. Carullo stated this is just another way of attempting to get their attention I have never enforced.

The licensee and witness were sworn in. Mr. Coates submitted (Board's Exhibit #1) Board's Investigation Report Dated: August 9, 2024, Compliance Check History, Alcohol Awareness Certified Employee List, and Ocean City Police Department (OCPD) Incident Case Report #2024-003107, into evidence regarding violations that occurred on July 17, 2024. Mr. Coates asked the licensee did they receive this information and were there any corrections or changes. Myers stated "Yes," the information was received and there are no corrections or changes stating that we are completely responsible for this violation. **Hearing Minutes: The** attorney Mark Cropper, Esquire introduced himself to the Board and stated he is representing Trattoria Lombardi's today for a Class "B" B/W/L 7 Day Violation of Alcoholic Beverages Article, Section 6-304 (Sales to Minors). Mr. Coates submitted (Board's Exhibit #1) Board's Investigation Report Dated: August 14, 2024, Compliance Check History, Alcohol Awareness Certified Employee List, and Ocean City Police Department Incident Case Report #2024-002402, into evidence regarding violations that occurred on June 25, 2024. Mr. Coates asked Cropper did he receive this information and were there any corrections or changes. Cropper stated "Yes," there are no corrections or changes we are here today for mitigation. Cropper asked Holloway how many years she has been employed with Lombardi's. Holloway stated she has been with Lombardi's for 42 years. Cropper submitted (Licensee's Exhibit #1) letter from Ines Salla, server that served the minors. Cropper asked Holloway is the server still employed. Hollway stated "No," she has returned to her country. Cropper read the letter from Salla, aloud to the Board where she states taking full responsibility for the incident and stated that she had received training regarding the importance of verifying IDs, especially the vertical IDs. Cropper asked Holloway to tell the Board what the training process is at Lombardi's. Holloway stated at Lombardi's we have a long training process making sure new employees have a understanding of the restaurant policies and operating processes, when the employee is placed on the floor we have the new servers shadow experienced servers that are veterans some of servers have been with this establishment for over 20 years, the servers follow this training process for numerous days interacting with the customers and then we have the new servers switch with the experience servers so that the experience server can observe the new employee. Holloway stated herself along with other managers are hands on and usually always have clear view of our servers so that we can intervein if we are suspension, we can quickly step in and ask for ID once again to ensure the patrons are not underage. Holloway stated that all our year-round staff are TIPs/TAM trained, unfortunately we are not able to get the J1s trained because they are only with us a short period of time. Holloway stated that it has always been Lombardi's policy not to accept vertical IDs period, we've had families come to celebrate their son or daughter turning 21 and present a vertical ID, and we have refused service upsetting the dining party, our reply

Hearing Minutes: The licensee Rocco F. DeFilippo appeared before the Board for a Class "B" 7 Day License Violation of Violation of Alcoholic Beverages Article, Section 6-304 (Sales to Minors) Violation of Alcoholic Beverages Article, Section 33-208 Boards Rules and Regulations Rules, 7, 9, 10 and 32 D. 6. and 14. has occurred. The licensee and witnesses were sworn in. Mr. Coates submitted (Board's Collective Exhibit #1) Board's Investigation Report Dated: August 9, 2024, Compliance Check History, Alcohol Awareness Certified Employee List, and Ocean City Police Department (OCPD) Incident Case Report #2024-001279 regarding violations that occurred on May 31, 2024, also attached to report OCPD Case Report #2024-003396 for a noise violation that occurred on July 29, 2024, into evidence. Mr. Coates asked Cropper did they receive this information and were there any corrections or changes. Cropper stated "Yes," they had received and there are no corrections or changes we are here today for mitigation. Cropper asked Difilippo to explain the establishments training process. Difilippo stated we have our new servers shadow our experience servers for about seven days, and we have signs posted throughout the kitchen area, and all servers must be TIPs/TAM certified. Ochse stated we put all new hires through additional training on how to check IDs and identify fake IDs, noting we don't allow new employees to step on the floor to serve until we feel they are ready. Cropper stated that Harmon, the server that served the two minor cadets had only been employed for three days and lacked experience. Ochse stated he is confused how this could have happened because we had just met with Harmon along with other staff members that morning to review the ID checking process. Cropper stated to DiFilippo as a part of your license restrictions you are not allowed to have a disc jockey (DJ), over the years you have had a person that would select music based on the age, and charter of your crowd which is different from a DJ. DiFilippo replied "Correct." Cropper asked DiFilippo the night of the noise violation Deliurman was the manager on duty unfortunately was not familiar with Guido's Burritos license restrictions as you and Ochse. "Correct." Cropper

asked DiFilippo, you do understand that it is your responsibility as the license holder that your management understand the difference between a DJ and a person playing music. DiFilippo replied "Yes." Cropper stated that since this violation you have met with all your management staff to explain to them the license restrictions in detail to ensure this type of incident does not happen again. DiFilippo replied "Correct." Cropper stated DiFilippo along with the violation regarding your license restrictions Guido's also received a noise violation, since this incident can you tell the Board what steps you have taken to resolve this issue. DiFilippo stated there was a speaker in front that was facing the Boardwalk, we have moved this speaker to the back of the building and have lowered the volume. Sgt. Smith stated that he had no knowledge of the noise violation, they were polite and cooperative regarding the sales to minors violation. PFC. Calabrese gave testimony that he was conducting a bicycle patrol in the area, when I heard loud music emanating from Guido's Burritos. As I approached the establishment, I could see a disc jockey (DJ), who was recognized as Caleb Ochse, I observed sound amplification equipment that projected music out to the bar patrons. It was also observed that Ochse was manipulating the controls of the equipment as well as using a microphone to interact with the bar patrons. Calabrese stated he took numerous meter readings ranging from 75.9 decibel to 87.4 decibel, all of which are above the Ocean City noise ordinance standard of less that 55 decibel at night. PFC stated it should be noted Ochse would lower the music as soon as I was in view and then turn the music up as I was walking away, this felt like playing tag. Commissioner Nichols asked who the DJ was. PFC. Calabrese stated his name is Caleb Ochse, and we have witnessed him at this establishment the entire summer, mainly on Sundays. Commissioner Nichols asked if he was still operating on Sundays as a DJ. PFC. Calabrese stated he has observed him there since the incident. M. Ochse, General Manager (GM) stated that "No," as someone that is choosing the music not acting as a DJ. PFC Calabrese stated that he was unaware this was a license restriction noting that C. Ochse was observed several times throughout the summer performing as a DJ at this property. Commissioner Nichols asked the question this person has been performing at this establishment the entire summer. DiFilippo stated "Yes," for years stating that we were unaware of the violation using the microphone until we received it in the mail. DiFilippo stated Ochse had not used the microphone in the past years, I'm not sure why he began using a microphone as a practice, if we were aware of the license restriction we would have taken steps to stop this practice. Commissioner Pusey asked what OCPD procedure is with enforcing establishments that violate the noise ordinance that don't hold a liquor license. PFC. Calabrese stated "Yes," there can be a fine imposed, with this incident I was instructed by "Chain of Command" to forward the report to this Board. Commissioner Nichols questioned M. Ochse about what his relationship with the DJ was and did he hire him. M. Ochse stated he's my brother, and I did not hire him years ago. Commissioner Nichols asked M. Ochse you are the GM, so you do manage what he does at the property. M. Ochse stated "Yes." Commissioner Pusey asked Deliurman if you were the manager on duty that night were you made aware that officers were on the property regarding the noise. Deliurman stated "No." Commissioner Nichols asked M. Ochse were you aware of what was going on that night. Ochse replied "No." Cropper asked Ochse when he was made aware of the incident. Ochse stated he only know of this incident when the notice of this hearing was received. DiFilippo stated this is also when he was made aware of the incident, I'm not sure if Deliurman didn't know because this may have been between the DJ and the officer. Commissioner Esham stated what I find most disturbing is that a license holder wasn't aware of their license restriction regarding a DJ and interacting with patrons. Commissioner Nichols stated to M. Ochse you are the GM, how long has this been going on, a person acting as a DJ and interacting with the patrons. M. Ochse stated there is a fine line between someone that picks the music and someone that interacts with the patrons. Commissioner Nichols reminded Ochse he is under oath. Ochse stated "Understood." Ochse stated it had only happened three times after the incident in July. Commissioner Esham stated to Ochse you gave testimony under oath that you didn't know anything about this until a week ago when you received the report, what is the truth. Ochse stated the use of the microphone happened a couple times after the July incident. Commissioner Esham, how did you find out about the violation. Ochse stated when I received the report. Cropper asked Ochse when this report was delivered. Administrator Payne stated the summons were mailed to the licensees on September 3, 2024. Cropper stated the reason I'm questioning this is asking Ochse you are stating you were not made aware of these violations until September 3, 2024. Ochse stated "Correct." Cropper asked Ochse if it is also correct you were not aware that the establishment was in violation using a DJ. Ochse stated "Yes." Commissioner Nichols stated he heard M. Ochse gave testimony under oath that a DJ, his brother had performed with a microphone several times before July 29th. Cropper stated he is not disputing this he is stating that DiFilippo and Ochse were not aware until September 3<sup>rd</sup> what the problem was associated, meaning they were allowed to have someone selecting the music to be played but were not allowed to

have that person using a microphone and interacting with the patrons. Commissioner Nichols asked Ochse, your brother did not contact you that night and never told you about the incident with the officers. Ochse stated "No."

Mr. Esham announced the Board will go into closed session. The Board is acting in its Quais-Judicial capacity and is not subject to the Open Meeting Act pursuant to Section 3-103 of the General Provisions Articles of the annotated Code of Maryland.

Mr. Coates announced the meeting is now being reconvened into an open session.

Following a motion by Commissioner Nichols, seconded by Commissioner Pusey and approved by Commissioner Esham, DiFilippo requested clarification regarding the establishment "must have their doors closed during any times music is being played." DiFilippo stated this establishment the only way of entrance to the building is to roll up the doors, there is no other way into the business.

Mr. Esham announced the Board will go into closed session. The Board is acting in its Quais-Judicial capacity and is not subject to the Open Meeting Act pursuant to Section 3-103 of the General Provisions Articles of the annotated Code of Maryland.

Mr. Coates announced the meeting is now being reconvened into an open session.

Commissioner Nichols stated he will amend his motion to delete all entertainment at this location, allowing the doors to remain open, Commissioner Pusey seconded the motion.
