<p><b>Hearing Minutes:</b> The applicant, accompanied by his attorney Mark Cropper, Esquire, appeared before the Board to present an application for the transfer of a Class "B" Beer/Wine/Liquor (B/W/L) 7-Day License. The applicant was sworn in. Cropper introduced himself to the Board as legal counsel representing Mark Mayers. Cropper noted that the application included a copy of the sublease and documentation of the business entity. He explained that Mayers will be the sole operator and manager of the restaurant, which previously operated as OCM Crabs. The new business, Pizza Mambo, will primarily serve Italian cuisine, offering both dine-in and take-out service. Mayers has approximately 40 years of experience in the bar and restaurant industry, having previously managed establishments for the Harrison Group. He has been semi-retired for the past three and a half years. Cropper submitted into evidence Applicant's Exhibit #1 – the site plan. He stated that the restaurant will have 70 indoor dining seats, 54 outdoor seats, and 8 bar stools in the outside area, along with a designated carry-out section. He described two ingress/egress points and explained that the intention is for all customers to enter and exit through the indoor area. The outdoor deck will be gated, and the four gated exits are to be used for emergency purposes only. Regarding the carry-out area, Cropper stated that there will be a cooler with Italian food items, and the applicant is requesting permission for off-sale of B/W/L to-go, if approved by the Board. The business plans to employ approximately 60 staff members, including up to 10 managers such as chef managers and hostess managers. Mayers is TIPS/TAMS certified. Cropper noted that the previous licensee had permission for live entertainment both indoors and outdoors three days per week, limited to a maximum of three performers, from 6:00 PM to 10:00 PM. The setup included 12 outdoor speakers. There was no use of a disc jockey or games. The applicant wishes to retain the same restrictions. Commissioner Nichols remarked that signage would be needed for the gated exits. Cropper then submitted Applicant's Exhibit #2 – a sign reading "See Hostess for Seating," and Applicant's Exhibit #3 – a sign reading "Exit Only." Mayers added that the patio is covered. Commissioner Pusey asked about hours of operation and whether food would be served after 2:00 AM. Mayers responded that carry-out service may continue until 3:00 AM, depending on demand, as late-night hours are typically busier.</p> <p>There were no further questions from the Board. Commissioner Pusey tentatively approved the application, pending any required documentation, which was seconded by Commissioner Nichols. The motion passed.</p>

<p><b>Hearing Minutes:</b> The applicant, accompanied by his attorney Spencer Cropper, Esquire, appeared before the Board with a request to increase the size of the bar and restaurant, to add four pool tables and fifteen arcade games, and to create a designated area for alcoholic beverage storage. The applicant was sworn in. Cropper introduced himself to the Board as representing Juan Acita, owner of Pickles Pub. Acita has owned and operated Pickles Pub for nearly eleven years with no prior violations. The expansion request involves the unit located immediately north of the existing premises. Acita explained that the expansion is intended to create a game area and alleviate congestion in the main dining area, as there is customer demand for additional pool tables. If approved, the expansion would cover approximately 1,750 square feet and would include four pool tables, fifteen arcade games, and twelve additional seats. Cropper noted that the lease for the adjoining space was executed prior to the hearing. Cropper asked Cranmer, Director of Operations for Pickles Pub, to explain how the current space is configured and how the expansion would be integrated. Cranmer stated that two areas of the current layout frequently experience congestion—near the music area and at the point of entry. With the proposed expansion, tables and seating will be rearranged to improve customer flow and overall experience. The additional space will also provide staff with more room to operate efficiently. A window will be installed on the north end of the current Pickles Pub to connect the two units. Cropper submitted Applicant's Exhibit #1 – a layout of the property and seating chart – into evidence. Commissioner Nichols asked who owns the arcade games. Cranmer responded that a third-party company owns and maintains the machines, and revenue is shared between the company and Pickles Pub. Commissioner Pusey asked whether the expansion would use the same entry point currently in place. Cropper confirmed that the same main entrance will be used, and that the additional doors will function strictly as emergency exits.</p> <p>There were no further questions from the Board. Commissioner Nichols made a motion to approve the request, which was seconded by Commissioner Pusey. The motion carried.</p>

<p><b>Hearing Minutes:</b> The applicants, accompanied by their attorney Hugh Cropper, Esquire, appeared before the Board with an application for a Class "B" Beer/Wine/Liquor (B/W/L) 7-Day License. The applicants were sworn in. Cropper introduced himself to the Board as representing Bauer and Lilliston. Cropper began by introducing Bauer, who will be the 99% owner of the business. Bauer has twelve years of experience in the bar and restaurant industry. The concept for the property is a "coffee and cocktails" establishment, offering coffee service in the mornings and cocktails in the afternoons. Cropper submitted Applicant's Exhibit #1 – a packet containing the business plan and menu. He noted that the anticipated clientele will primarily be residents of the adjoining condominium building. The space includes seating for 75 patrons. Cropper then submitted Applicant's Exhibit #2 – Google Maps images showing the location of parking and access to the building. He also noted that this location has held prior licenses in the past. Lilliston is proposed as the qualified resident agent for the license. Commissioner Esham inquired whether the deck area of the condominium is included in the lease. Coates noted that the lease only references Unit 101 and does not include the deck area. Coates clarified that the deck would require a separate lease agreement with the Homeowners Association (HOA), not with the landlord. Cropper stated that the HOA is willing to lease the deck space. Cropper explained that alcohol service will be limited to the dining area, and any other exits would be gated. The space still allows access to the stairs and condominium units if necessary. Administrator Payne expressed concern about creating non-continuous licensed premises. Coates recommended licensing only Unit 101, as described in the lease presented today, and suggested the applicants could return later to request an expansion once a clear site plan and lease for the deck are available. Commissioner Esham agreed that this approach would be the safest and most appropriate, consistent with Administrator Payne's recommendation. Bauer proposed placing a mobile service bar on the deck to avoid transporting alcohol through unlicensed areas. Commissioner Nichols asked whether Mr. Ramadan owns the unit the applicants intend to lease. The applicants confirmed that he does. Coates added that Ramadan and his investment group are the owners of the unit and that the lease appears to be in order. Commissioner Esham requested confirmation that the lease does not include a clause granting Ramadan a percentage of the food or alcohol revenue. Cropper affirmed that this is not stipulated in the lease. Cropper formally amended the application to include only Unit 101, as specified in the lease and detailed in Applicant's Exhibit the business plan packet. Commissioner Nichols made a motion to grant the license, which was seconded by Commissioner Pusey. The motion carried.</p>

<b>Hearing Minutes:</b> The applicant, accompanied by her attorney Brian Cosby, Esquire, appeared before the Board with two requests: (1) to increase the amplified music restriction from four to five pieces, and (2) to allow for a disc jockey up to two days per week from 4:00 p.m. until 11:00 p.m., under the condition that no other amplified or non-amplified live entertainment would occur simultaneously. The applicant was sworn in. Cosby introduced himself to the Board as representing McGrath. McGrath explained that they have received frequent requests from bands who require five pieces to perform their full set. Additionally, they wish to have a DJ on nights when live bands are not performing, with no more than two DJ nights per week. She noted there have been no violations or noise complaints since their last appearance before the Board. Kollender, a sound engineer with over four years of experience, was present and stated that he is consistently on-site to monitor sound levels. Cosby acknowledged that noise has historically been a concern for nearby residents and emphasized that controlling volume is part of Kollender's responsibility. Kollender described his approach to managing sound, referencing sound pressure levels and air displacement. His goal is to maintain volume levels that avoid hearing loss, allow for normal conversation within the venue, and prevent disturbances to neighbors. He noted that the majority of the clientele is over 50 years old, although younger patrons do attend occasionally. Cosby asked Kollender whether the addition of a fifth band member would significantly affect the volume. Kollender replied that it would not, explaining that volume control is not directly impacted by the number of instruments but rather by how individual components are managed. Ruppel, a local DJ with 44 years of experience, spoke in support of the request. He stated that recent restrictions have negatively impacted his business and noted that he primarily plays music that appeals to the older local community. When asked by Cosby whether adding a DJ would benefit Beach Barrels, Ruppel confirmed that it would, as the clientele would appreciate and enjoy that form of entertainment. Coates informed the Board that a letter of opposition was received from Pollack, a resident of a neighboring condominium. Pollack objected to the addition of a fifth performer but did not oppose the inclusion of a DJ. Cosby addressed the letter, noting that Pollack's concern related to potential noise from additional performers. However, as previously explained by Kollender, the sound level						

would remain controlled regardless of the number of musicians. Commissioner Pusey asked if the garage-style entry remains open during performances. McGrath confirmed that the entrance is always closed when music is being played. Commissioner Pusey also inquired whether the fifth musician would typically be a drummer. Administrator Payne responded that drums are already permitted, and Kollender clarified that the fifth piece is usually a keyboard player. Commissioner Nichols asked how the venue plans to manage DJs. McGrath explained that they are selective in hiring, seeking DJs whose style aligns with their customer base. Commissioner Esham emphasized that DJs and live bands will not perform at the same time under any circumstances. He also noted, for the record, that all individuals who attended previous hearings regarding this request had been notified of the current hearing, and only Pollack submitted a response. Commissioner Pusey asked whether the applicants would consider reducing the DJ hours to end at 10:00 p.m. McGrath expressed a preference to keep the hours until 11:00 p.m. Commissioner Nichols clarified that the DJ would be permitted for up to two nights per week. Commissioner Esham concluded by noting that there have been no noise complaints or police reports in the past twelve months.
