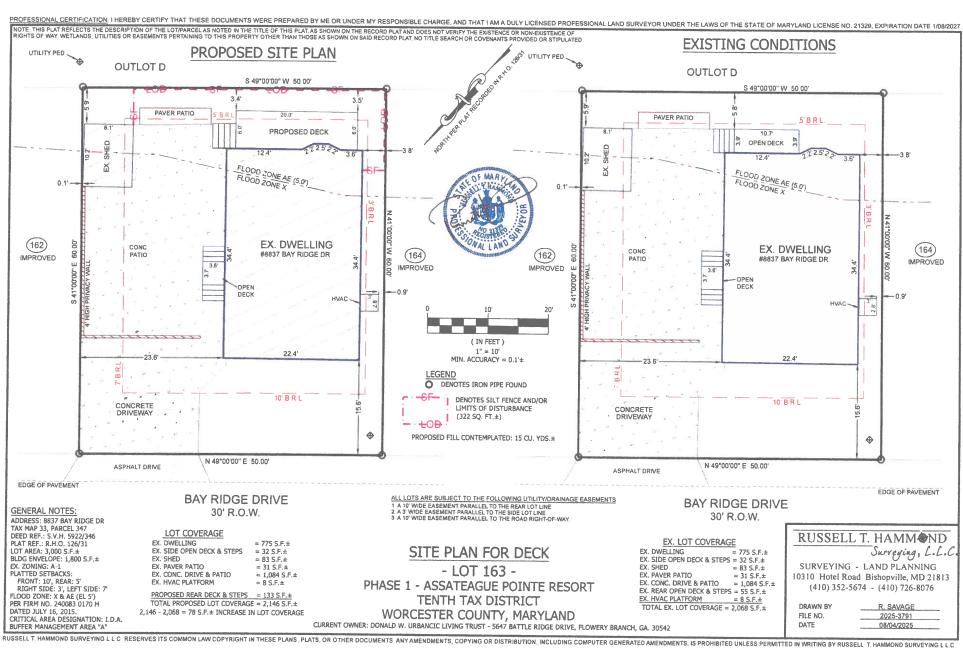

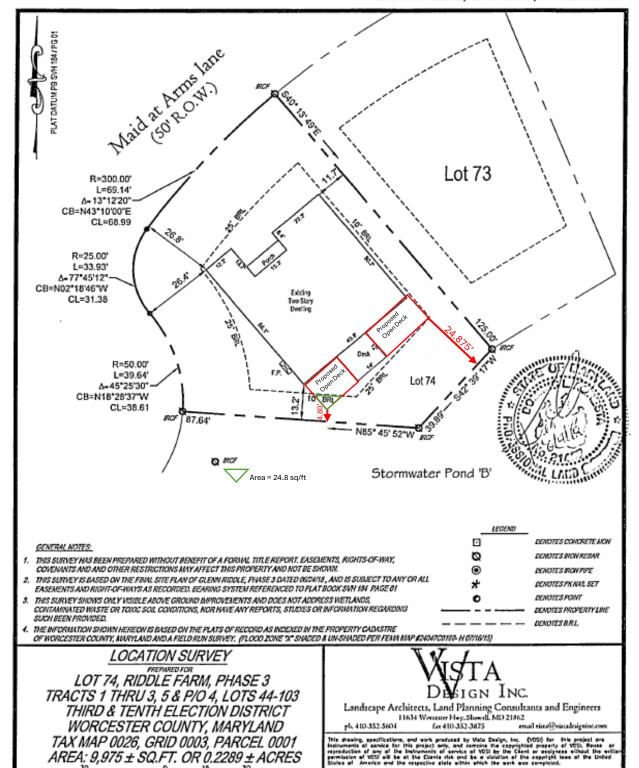

COMMENTS: The property owners operate a poultry farm on their 62-acre property where they also have their residence. They are proposing a minor subdivision of five (5) lots and are requesting five (5) variances associated with this request. The three (3) existing poultry houses (and manure shed) would be located on a 15.87 acre parcel; the applicants' residence would be on a 2.35 acre parcel; and three (3) new undeveloped lots would be created consisting of 2.06 acres; 2.65 acres; and 39.23 acres, respectively. The Code requires a 200' setback from poultry houses to all property lines – the three (3) poultry houses are proposed to be 100 feet from the new side and front lot lines created by the subdivision accounting for three (3) variances. An existing manure shed would

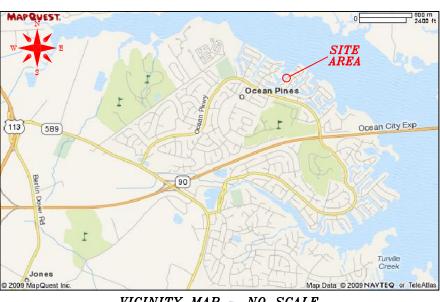

APPROVAL REQUESTED: A special exception for the enlargement of a nonconforming structure (single-family residence) and three (3) variances including (1) a variance to the side yard setback from 20 feet to 11.2 feet (to encroach 8.8 feet) for the dwelling; (2) a variance to the side yard setback from 20 feet to 13.5 feet (to encroach 6.5 feet) for a proposed deck and steps; and (3) an after-the-fact variance to the side yard setback from 20 feet to 3.7 feet (to encroach 16.3 feet) for an existing shed in the A-2 Agricultural District.

PROPERTY HISTORY: The property is improved with a residence constructed in 1930 with the following records on file:

COMMENTS: The property owners propose to enlarge a single-family residence that is located entirely outside of this lot's building envelope. The proposed improvements outside of the building envelope total 293 s.f., which is an increase of approximately 40% of the area of the current nonconforming structure (the Code limits the expansion of the nonconformity to no more than 50%). The proposed improvements that will require a variance include the addition to the existing dwelling (requiring an 8.8' side yard setback variance) and a proposed deck with steps (requiring a 6.5' side yard setback variance). In addition, the applicant is requesting a 16.3' side yard setback variance for an existing shed.

With respect to the special exception request, the Board must make findings that the proposed use or structure:

- 1. Will be in conformance with the County's Comprehensive Plan.
- 2. Will be in harmony with the general character of the neighborhood considering population density, the design, scale and bulk of any proposed new structures, the intensity and character of the activity, traffic and parking conditions or the number of similar uses.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE AND JUSTIFICATION IN SUPPORT OF APPLICATION FOR VARIANCE

Petitioner, John Jason Skidmore ("Skidmore"), by his attorneys, Breza & Associates, LLC, submits this Statement of Purpose and Justification in regard to its Application for a Variance (the "Application") to demonstrate conformance of the requested Variance relief with all applicable review requirements and criteria. As outlined on the Tax Map (attached as **Exhibit "1"**), the property that is the subject of the Application consists of approximately 19,018 square feet (+/-) (referred to in the Land Records of Worcester County, Maryland at Deed Liber 08579, Folio 00462, see **Exhibit "2"**), more formally known as all of Lot 122, Parcel 0273, on Tax Map 0021, Grid 000, Neighborhood 3030143.24 (the "**Property**"), and as shown on the Site Plan to Accompany Building Permit Application (the "**Site Plan**") (attached as **Exhibit "3"**) dated August 19, 2024, prepared by Samuel T. Hutchins, Professional Land Surveyor #21682, of STH Land Services, LLC.

As shown on the 2009 Official Zoning Map, attached as **Exhibit "4"**, the Property is located in the R-3 (Multi-family Residential District) Zone, as set forth in §ZS 1-207 of the Worcester County MD Code (the "**Zoning Ordinance**") (See §ZS 1-207 on **Exhibit "5"**).

The Petitioner, as legal owner of the Property, requests a Variance of the six-foot (6") setback on the Northeast border of the side yard as shown on the Site Plan, which Site Plan reflects a setback of zero on the Northeast border of the side yard such that the improvements abut the property line of the Property and the adjacent property. The legal owners of the adjacent property are in support of Petitioner's request for the herein described Variance.

Section ZS 1-116(c)(4) [Variance] of the Zoning Ordinance (attached as **Exhibit "6"**) indicate that a variance may be granted if special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure or building, along with the 3 additional factors are met. The Petitioner hereby requests a Variance from the side yard setback of six (6) feet as set forth in Section ZS 1-207(b)(2). The Petitioner is hereby requesting approval for the Variance such that the setback be reduced to zero as shown on the Site Plan.

I. BACKGROUND

The Property was purchased by Petitioner in 2023 and the Property is currently used by Petitioner. The current residence was constructed on or about 1983. All major utilities necessary to service the Property are immediately available and adequate. The main residence is connected to public water and sewer. The site was developed in accordance with the developer's storm water management plan and in relation to the topography of the site. The majority of the site appears to

drain toward the storm water management facility. No neighbor has complained about any drainage issue.

The use of the Property complies with the 2006 Comprehensive Plan for the County of Worcester, as updated. The County of Worcester approved the original subdivision with the R-3 zoning in place at that time. The Property was designated for residential purposes. This neighborhood includes other residential homes along Mallard Drive. For these reasons, the R-3 zoning of the Property is consistent with the existing Comprehensive Plan for current and future development of the area.

The Petitioner intends to construct the proposed pool and proposed deck complex as shown on the Site Plan, but otherwise shall continue to use the Property in a similar manner to how it has been used historically. It is anticipated that the remaining areas of the Property shall be within the required setback lines. In fact, the proposed plan reduces the lot coverage within the Building Management Area (BMA).

All relevant permits shall be in place at the time the proposed pool and related improvements are constructed. The existing Site Plan was drawn with the surrounding area in mind in terms of scale, bulk, height, materials and textures, and remains compatible with the character of the neighborhood.

II. PROPOSED CHANGES OF THE EXISTING STRUCTURES AT THE PROPERTY

As shown on the Site Plan, and as outlined above, the Petitioner will be replacing the existing deck and patio with the proposed pool and proposed deck complex. Architectural plans demonstrate the changes will be in character with the existing structure and the neighboring

properties as well, see <u>Exhibit "7"</u>. An aerial photograph of the Property which includes the front, side and rear yard, as well as the adjacent neighbor's property is attached as <u>Exhibit "8"</u>.

Care will be taken to build the proposed pool and proposed deck complex to be architecturally compatible with the existing structure, and with nearby residential properties in its scale, bulk, height, materials, and textures. The proposed pool and proposed deck complex shall be constructed using high quality materials. The nearest adjacent home is 24 West Mallard Drive and the owner of that property is in support of the proposed Variance as shown on the letter of support provided by them and attached hereto as **Exhibit "9"**.

The Property sits at the end of a cul-de-sac and is one of the rear lots. The Property has an almost triangular shape. The Property is bordered on the West side by 24 West Mallard Drive and the owners of that property are in support of the Site Plan and requested Variance.

III. BUILDING STANDARDS IN R-3 ZONE, SECTION ZS 1-207 AND RELIEF

Section ZS 1-207(b)(2) (Permitted principal uses and structures) is relevant to this Application. The residence is a single-family dwelling. The residence sits within the required setbacks, with the exception only of the Northeast border of the side yard as shown on the Site Plan. This section requires that the front yard setback is 25 ft., each side yard setback is 6 ft., and the rear yard setback is 30 ft.

Petitioner hereby requests relief from Section ZS 1-207(b)(2), to permit the side yard setback to be less than 6 feet. The specific Variance relief sought is to reduce this distance to zero for the western side yard setback as set forth in the Site Plan.

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IV. FACTORS FOR CONSIDERATION OF VARIANCE

Section ZS 1-116(c)(4) indicates *The Board of Zoning Appeals may authorize, upon appeal, in specific cases such variance from the setback or lot area provision of this Title as will not be contrary to the public interest where, owing to special or unique conditions, a literal enforcement of the provisions of this Title would result in unnecessary hardship other than a financial nature.*

- A. A variance from the terms of this title shall not be granted unless and until the applicant has demonstrated each of the following:
 - 1. Special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the lend, structure, or building involved.
 - 2. Literal interpretation of the provisions of this Title would deprive the applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the same district under the terms of this Title.
 - 3. The special conditions or circumstances did not result from actions of the applicant.
 - 4. The condition of circumstances is not one that could be reasonable provided for under legislation of general applicability within the zoning district and shall be granted only on account of the uniqueness of the situation.

V. CONSIDERATIONS FOR APPROVAL OF REQUESTED VARIANCE RELIEF

The proposed reduction or waiver of the six (6) foot setback to zero for the proposed replacement of the existing deck with a deck, pool and related improvements. The witnesses for the Petitioner shall describe how the Petitioner has maintained the residence and land, and how the proposed changes fit on the Property in the R-3 zone and will not adversely affect the public health, safety, or general welfare of people or property in the neighborhood.

Consideration of the above factors applicable to Variances as outlined in Section ZS 1-116(c)(4) as applied to the Application support approval of the requested relief. The Petitioner's Property has special conditions and circumstances. The Petitioner's lot is "pie" shaped, having very narrow street frontage, and expanding in width toward the water. That combined with the wider BMA along the water results in a smaller and difficulty shaped building envelope. In addition, the existing structure intrudes significantly into the BMA. In order to repair/replace the

deck, the Petitioner either has to continue the significant intrusion into the BMA, or to seek relief from the side yard setback. The proposed plan reduces the lot coverage within the BMA by 172 square feet. The lot is also unusual in that it is at the end of a cul-de-sac on the water, therefore, the number of people living in the immediate vicinity is low, and the closest adjacent home is in support of this request. To deny the requested relief would preclude Petitioner from improvements similar to the nearby properties and result in continued use in the BMA. The proposed Variance is compatible with the scale of the building and the land, and there is no sufficient detrimental impact on the community that would require denial of this Application. No adverse traffic conditions or other negative impacts are created by approving this Variance. Fire, police, and health services will continue to have easy access to the site over the paved roadway from Mallard Drive. Neighbors will continue to enjoy their own properties without concern about dust, noise, odors, and lighting.

The proposed relief should be granted pursuant to the Application for the following reasons: The Petitioner has demonstrated the reduction of the setback to zero will be in harmony with the general character of the neighborhood; such reduction will not be detrimental to the use, peaceful enjoyment, economic value or development of surrounding property or surrounding neighborhoods, will cause no objectionable noise, vibration, fumes, odors, dust, glare or physical activity, and will not have a detrimental effect on ground-or-surface-water quality; such reduction will have no detrimental effect on vehicular or pedestrian traffic; and such reduction will not overburden existing public services and facilities.

VI. SUMMARY

The proposed reduced setback will not alter the character of the surrounding neighborhood.

By approving this necessary Variance, the Property will remain a family residence well suited for

a single family dwelling and will diminish the intrusion into the BMA. The proposed reduced

setback will not place any additional burden on area schools, police and fire protection, and/or

roads and storm drainage. The existing improvements will remain and will continue to have no

objectionable traffic, noise, odors, dust, or illumination impacts on the neighborhood.

Petitioner respectfully requests approval of the Variance without conditions. In addition to

the foregoing, Petitioner reserves the right to submit additional evidence and justification not

included in this Application as well as call additional witnesses and submit such other reports and

exhibits as it deems necessary.

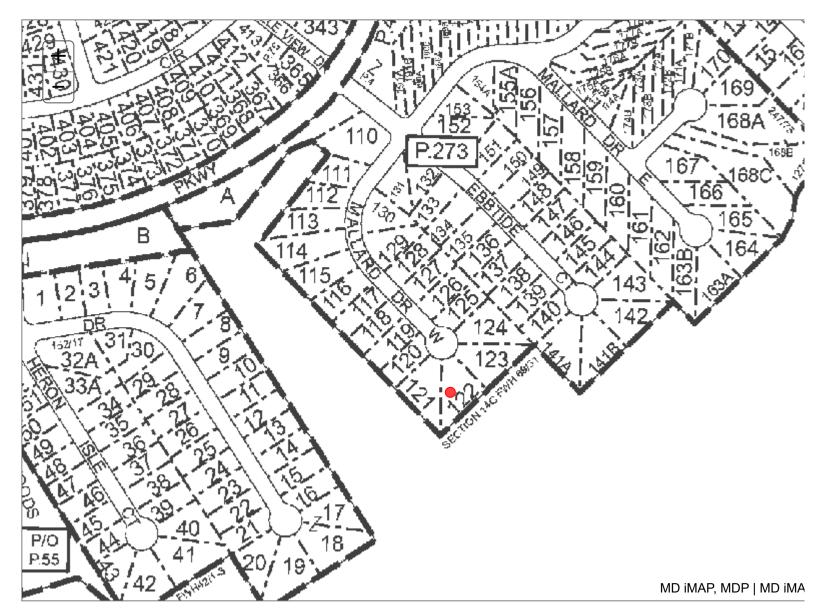

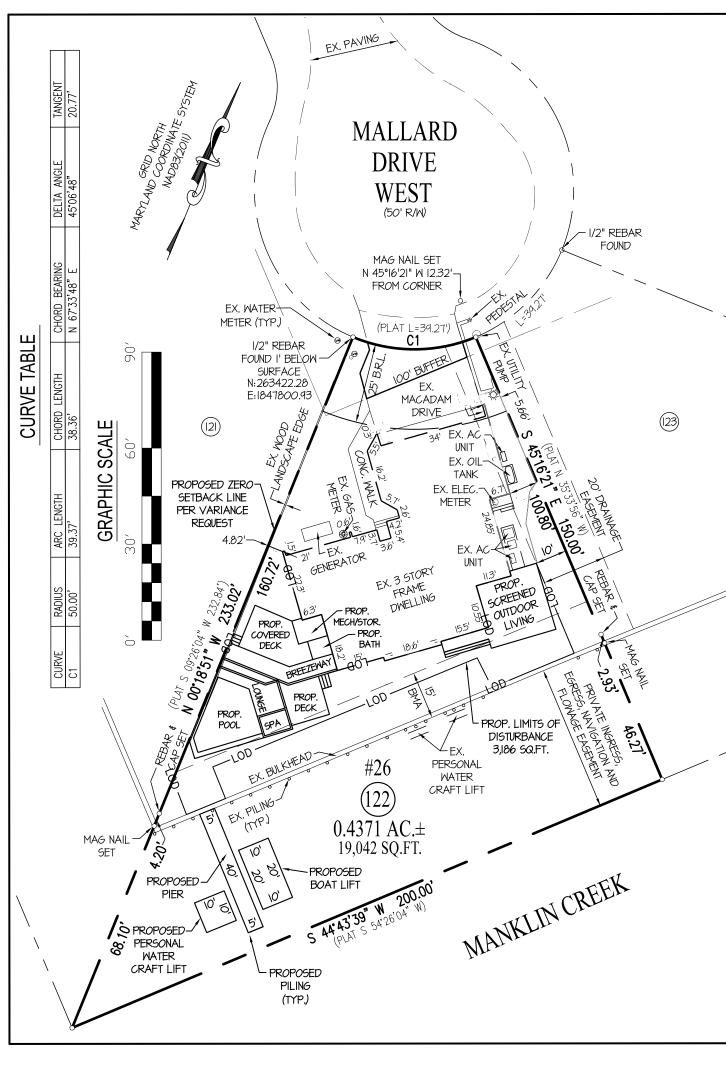

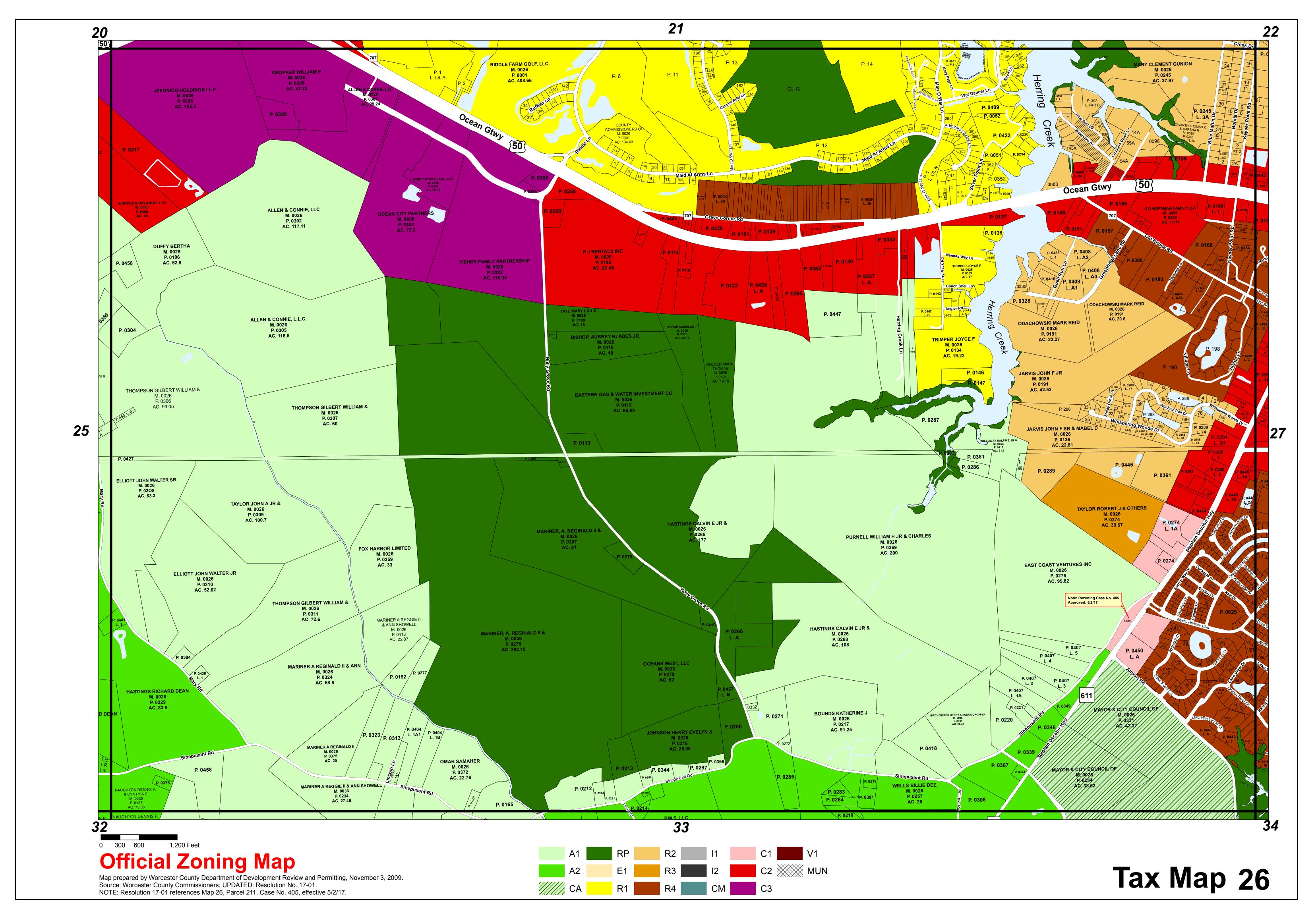


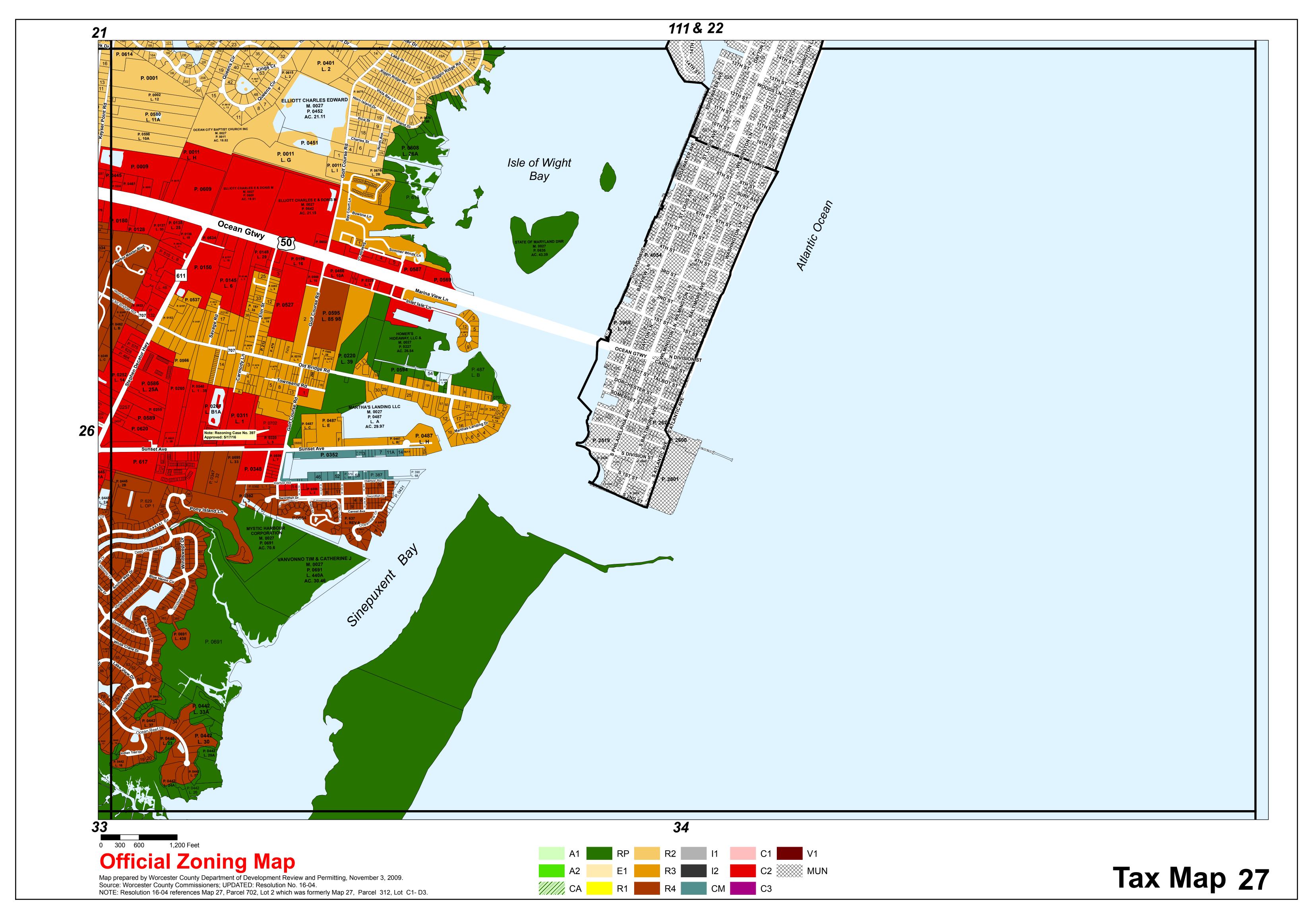


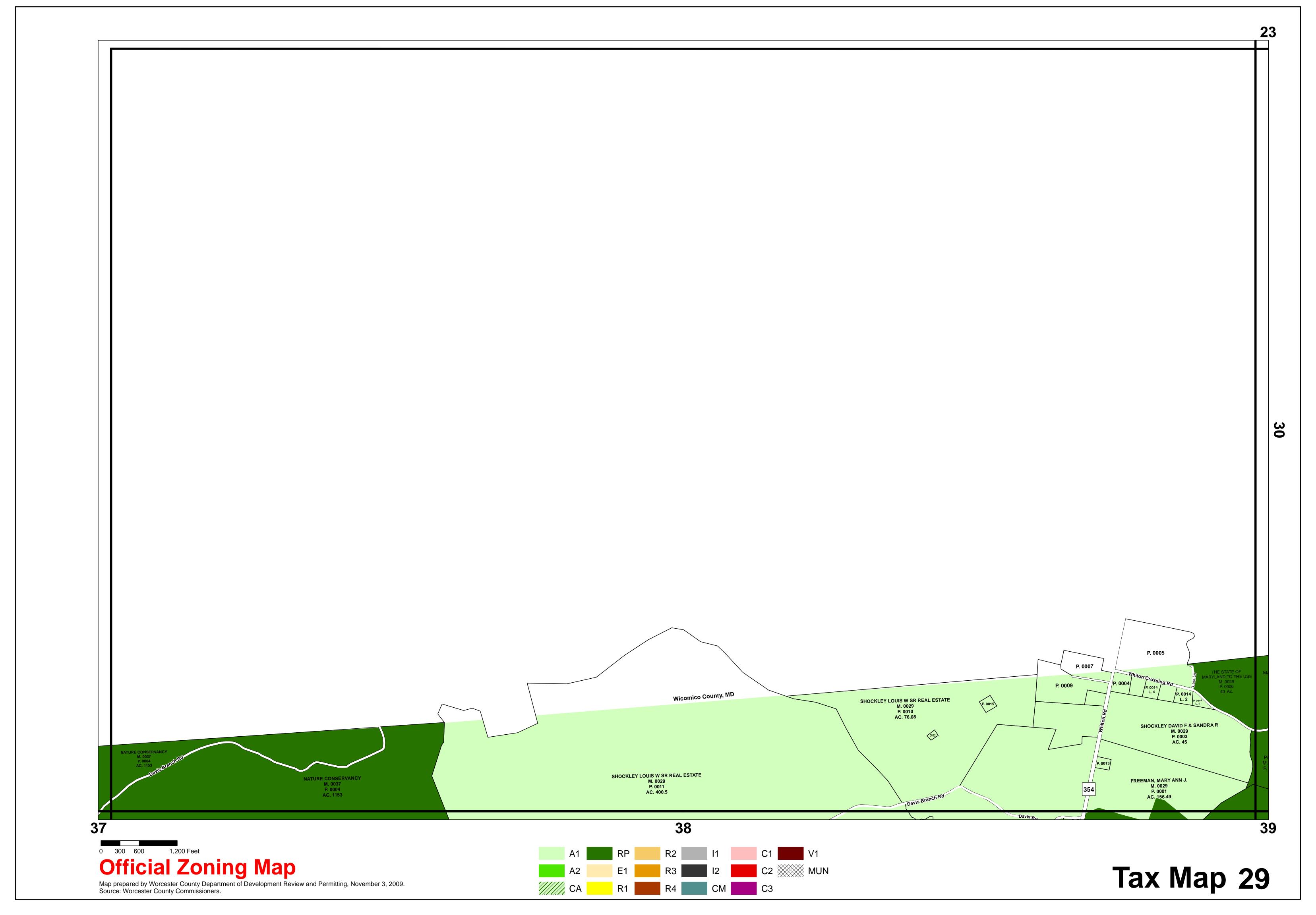


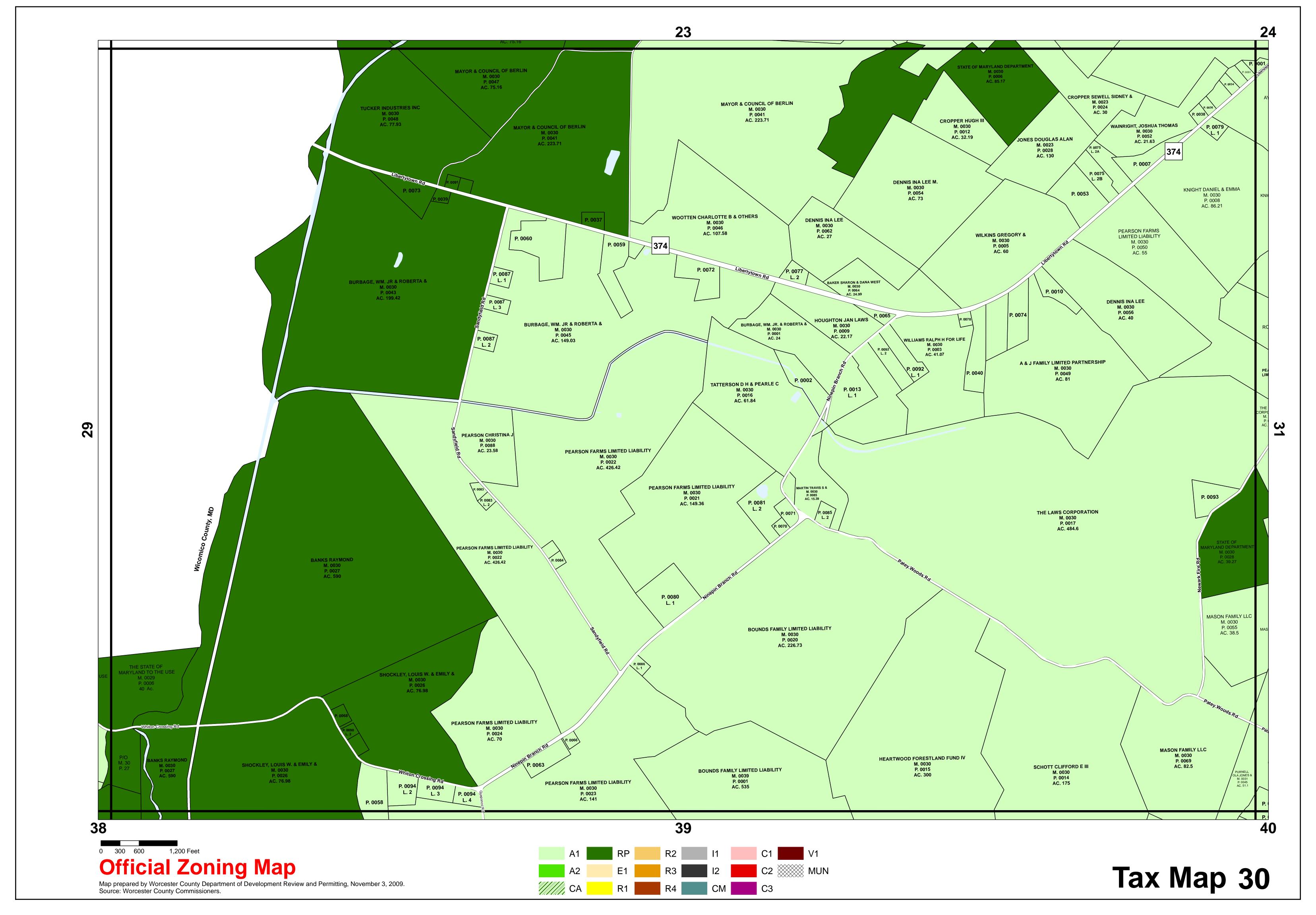












§ ZS 1-207. R-3 Multi-family Residential District.

- (a) Purpose and intent. This district is intended to protect and preserve existing residential subdivisions throughout the County and to provide for compatible infill development in those areas. Furthermore, as contemplated by the Comprehensive Plan, this district can serve as the core of a traditional neighborhood development, where the highest densities are desired. The Comprehensive Plan recommends that designated growth areas be developed as traditional neighborhoods. Projects of more than twenty dwelling units which are proposed after the effective date of this Title are required to be developed as residential planned communities in order to encourage traditional neighborhood development and utilization of conservation design principles. Therefore, new development in this district may be at densities higher than that cited below as the maximum density, provided adequate sewer service is available, while infill development in existing developed areas shall be at densities consistent with those allowed by the primary district regulations.
- (b) <u>Permitted principal uses and structures.</u> The following uses and structures are permitted in the R-3 District:
 - (1) Single-family clustered housing. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, six thousand square feet; maximum density, six units per net acre; lot width, fifty feet; front yard setback, fifteen feet; each side yard setback, five feet; and rear yard setback, twenty feet; and subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-307 hereof.
 - (2) Single-family dwellings. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, ten thousand square feet [see § ZS 1-305(l) hereof]; maximum density, six units per net acre; lot width, eighty feet; front yard setback, twenty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, six feet; and rear yard setback, thirty feet.
 - (3) Manufactured homes in accordance with § ZS 1-314(b) hereof. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, ten thousand square feet [see § ZS 1-305(l) hereof]; maximum density, six units per net acre; lot width, eighty feet; front yard setback, twenty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, six feet; and rear yard setback, thirty feet.
 - (4) Two-family and multi-family dwellings. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, twenty-four thousand square feet [see § ZS 1-305(l) hereof]; maximum density, six units per net acre; lot width, eighty feet; front yard setback, twenty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, six feet; rear yard setback, thirty feet; and subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-312 hereof.
 - (5) Townhouses. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, two thousand square feet [see § ZS 1-305(l) hereof]; maximum density, six units per net acre; lot width, eighteen feet for interior units and twenty-six feet for end units; front yard setback, fifteen feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, zero feet if joined by a party wall to another unit and eight feet if not; and rear yard setback, fifteen feet; and subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-313 hereof.
 - (6) Major and minor subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of § ZS 1-311 hereof.
 - (7) Group homes. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, ten thousand square feet

[see § ZS 1-305(l) hereof]; lot width, eighty feet; front yard setback, twenty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, six feet; and rear yard setback, thirty feet. The applicant shall provide evidence that such facility shall be of sufficient size to accommodate the proposed number of developmentally disabled persons and staff and that the facility will not constitute a nuisance. Such facility shall be subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-325 hereof, and no group home shall be located within one thousand feet from any other group home.

- (8) Firehouses, governmental offices and other public buildings, structures and uses of an administrative or public-service type which serve the needs of the local community only. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, twenty thousand square feet; lot width, one hundred feet; front yard setback, thirty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, thirty feet; and rear yard setback, thirty feet; and subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-325 hereof.
- (9) Public and private noncommercial cultural, social and recreational areas and centers, including parks, playgrounds, beaches, community centers and swimming pools provided as an amenity to a use allowed as a permitted principal use or structure but excluding summer camps, fraternal lodges, marinas and boat landings. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, twenty thousand square feet; lot width, one hundred feet; front yard setback, twenty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, twenty feet; and rear yard setback, twenty feet; and subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-325 hereof. All outdoor swimming pools, including adjacent deck and patio areas, and locker areas shall be at least one hundred feet from any perimeter property lines and public road rights-of-way.
- (10) Public and private conservation areas, including wildlife reservations, arboretums and demonstration forests. Minimum lot requirements shall apply to structures only and shall be: lot area, forty thousand square feet; lot width, two hundred feet; front yard setback, twenty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, twenty feet; and rear yard setback, twenty feet.
- (11) Fishing, trapping and hunting blinds and wildlife observation structures. No lot requirements shall apply.
- (12) The addition to existing structures of telecommunications facilities that do not increase the overall height of the existing structure, subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-343 hereof.
- (13) Monopoles up to one hundred feet in height, subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-343 hereof
- (14) Small wind energy conversion systems up to a maximum of seventy-five feet in height, subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-344 hereof.
- (c) <u>Special exceptions.</u> The following principal uses and structures may be permitted by special exception in the R-3 District in accordance with the provisions of § ZS 1-116(c) hereof:
 - (1) Planned senior developments, subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-316 hereof.

(2) Assisted living facilities, provided they are residence-based and serve no more than five clients. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, ten thousand square feet [see § ZS 1-305(l) hereof]; lot width, eighty feet; front yard setback, thirty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, twenty feet; and rear yard setback, twenty feet; and subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-325 hereof.

- (3) Schools, including boarding schools. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, five acres; lot width, four hundred feet; front yard setback, thirty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, fifty feet; and rear yard setback, fifty feet.
- (4) Day-care centers. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, twelve thousand square feet [see § ZS 1-305(l) hereof]; lot width, eighty feet; front yard setback, twenty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, six feet; and rear yard setback, thirty feet.
- (5) Churches, temples and mosques. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, forty thousand square feet; lot width, two hundred feet; front yard setback, thirty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, thirty feet; and rear yard setback, thirty feet.
- (6) Cemeteries, including chapels and mausoleums. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, forty thousand square feet; lot width, two hundred feet; front yard setback, thirty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; and no side or rear yard setbacks required unless imposed by the Board. No structures, monuments or grave sites shall be located in any required yard setback.
- (7) Public and private noncommercial cultural, social, and recreational areas and centers, including fraternal lodges, marinas and boat landings. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, twenty thousand square feet; lot width, one hundred feet; front yard setback, twenty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, twenty feet; and rear yard setback, twenty feet; and subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-325 hereof. All swimming pools and locker areas shall be at least two hundred feet from any perimeter property lines and public road rights-of-way.
- (8) Private noncommercial marinas designed for the mooring, launching and fueling of pleasure craft, provided that dry storage and boat maintenance facilities do not exceed twenty-five feet in height. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, twenty thousand square feet; lot width, one hundred feet; front yard setback, thirty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, thirty feet; and rear yard setback, thirty feet; provided, however, that any such marina, boat storage, launching or maintenance facility must be incidental to a principal permitted use or structure, group of uses or group of structures and located on the same or on a contiguous lot or tract of land. Such marina, boat storage, launching or maintenance facility may serve a single lot or group of lots, provided that it is contiguous to one or more of such lots or a common area contiguous to and serving the lots. Any marina, boat storage, launching or maintenance facility may not provide for the docking, storage or maintenance of more than one boat per lot or per dwelling unit. The Board of Zoning Appeals may grant a waiver of the requirements of contiguousness, but in no event shall the marina, boat storage, launching or maintenance facility be permitted more than two hundred feet from the lot

or from one of the lots served.

- (9) Public utility structures and properties other than essential services as defined in § ZS 1-121 hereof, including cross-County lines and mains of all kinds, subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-325 hereof. Minimum lot requirements for construction, maintenance or storage buildings or yards shall be: lot area, twenty thousand square feet; lot width, one hundred feet; front yard setback, thirty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, thirty feet; and rear yard setback, thirty feet. See § ZS 1-328 hereof for lot requirements for all other facilities. During its review of any public utility structure or property, the Planning Commission may require screening, buffering or landscaping of said structure or property where deemed necessary to protect adjoining land uses.
- (10) Wastewater and water treatment facilities, with the exception of sewage sludge disposal areas, in accordance with the provisions of § ZS 1-328 hereof.
- (11) Spray irrigation fields and storage lagoons for Class II effluent in accordance with the provisions of § ZS 1-328(g) hereof.
- (12) Dredge spoil disposal sites. Lot requirements for dredge spoil disposal sites, special conditions of operation and conditions regarding reclamation of sites shall be as specified by the Board of Zoning Appeals.
- (13) The addition to existing structures of telecommunications facilities that have the effect of increasing the overall height of the existing structure, subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-343 hereof.
- (14) Monopoles over one hundred feet in height, but not exceeding one hundred ninety-nine feet, and freestanding towers up to one hundred feet in height, subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-343 hereof.
- (15) Heliports for emergency and law enforcement aircraft only and subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-345 hereof.
- (16) Large day-care homes. Minimum lot requirements shall be: lot area, twelve thousand square feet [see § ZS 1-305(1) hereof]; lot width, eighty feet; front yard setback, twenty-five feet [see § ZS 1-305(b) hereof]; each side yard setback, six feet; and rear yard setback, thirty feet. [Added 2-18-2014 by Bill No. 14-1¹]
- (17) Any use or structure which is determined by the Board of Zoning Appeals to be of the same general character as an above-permitted use, not specifically mentioned in another district and compatible with the general character and intent of the R-3 District.
- (d) <u>Accessory uses and structures.</u> The following accessory uses and structures shall be permitted in the R-3 District:
 - (1) Noncommercial private residential parking garages and areas, swimming pools and other customary residential outbuildings and structures for the use of residents.

(2) Customary incidental home occupations, subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-339 hereof.

- (3) The keeping of not more than two roomers or boarders.
- (4) Accessory apartments, subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-338 hereof.
- (5) Signs on the premises advertising a lawful use conducted on the premises and temporary and directional signs. All signs shall be subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-324 hereof.
- (6) Private waterfront structures, subject to the provisions of § NR 2-102 of the Natural Resources Article of the Code of Public Local Laws of Worcester County, Maryland and § ZS 1-335 hereof.
- (7) Temporary buildings and structures as provided for and regulated by § ZS 1-334 hereof.
- (8) Yard sales, subject to the provisions of § ZS 1-341 hereof.
- (e) <u>Height regulations.</u> Except for certain other buildings, structures or parts thereof as provided in § ZS 1-305 hereof, no flat-roofed principal structure shall exceed a height of thirty-five feet, no pitched-roofed principal structure shall exceed a height of forty-five feet, and no flat-or pitched-roofed principal structure shall exceed four stories. In addition, no accessory structure shall exceed either two stories or twenty-five feet in height.
- (f) Other regulations. The uses and structures permitted in the R-3 District shall be subject to the applicable regulations contained in Subtitle ZS1:I, General Provisions, and Subtitle ZS1:III, Supplementary Districts and District Regulations, of this Title.

§ ZS 1-116. Board of Zoning Appeals.

- (a) Establishment; composition, appointment and removal; vacancies; compensation; staff and resources. A Board of Zoning Appeals is hereby established (hereinafter called the "Board"). The Board shall consist of seven members appointed by the County Commissioners for staggered three-year terms or until a successor takes office. Members may, after a public hearing, be removed from office by the County Commissioners for inefficiency, neglect of duty or malfeasance in office. The County Commissioners shall file a written statement of reasons for such removal. Vacancies occurring otherwise than through the expiration of a term shall be filled for the unexpired term by the County Commissioners. Members may serve with such compensation as the County Commissioners deem appropriate. The Board may be supplied with such staff and resources as the County Commissioners deem appropriate.
- (b) Organization; voting; meetings; rules and records; assistance. The Board shall elect a Chairman from its membership. The Chairman's term shall be twelve months with eligibility for reelection. The Board shall have at least four members present and voting to conduct business. A majority of the members present and voting must vote in favor of any matter in order for it to be approved. Failure to obtain such affirmative vote of a majority of the members present and voting shall constitute a denial. After voting upon an application the Board shall not rehear, reconsider or reopen such matter except in accordance with Subsection (i) hereof. However, prior to a vote being taken, the Board may continue any case solely for the purposes of obtaining additional evidence or testimony deemed necessary by the Board to reach a proper conclusion, allowing time for studies or surveys to be performed to provide additional information to the Board or enabling applicants or protestants to prepare responses to issues that develop that could not have been reasonably foreseen. A continuance shall not be granted to the applicant simply for additional preparation time or the presence of opponents. The Board shall adopt rules for the transaction of business, which shall be posted in the office of the Department and be available to the public in written form. Meetings of the Board shall be held at the call of the Chairman and at such other times as the Board may determine. The Chairman or, in his absence, the Acting Chairman may administer oaths and compel the attendance of witnesses. The Board shall keep minutes of its proceedings showing the vote of each member upon each question or, if absent or failing to vote, indicating such fact and shall keep written records of its resolutions, transactions, testimonies, findings, decisions, determinations and other official actions, which records shall be a public record. Where specific findings are required or criteria apply, separate written findings shall be made on each of the criteria or findings. The Board may call upon any County official or department for assistance in the performance of its duties, and it shall be the duty of such officer or department to render such assistance to the Board as may reasonably be required.
- (c) <u>Powers with respect to zoning matters.</u> The Board shall have the following powers and functions:
 - (1) To hear and decide appeals where it is alleged that there is an error in the application of the law (but not in discretionary judgment) in any order, requirement, decision or determination made by the Department in the administration or enforcement of this Title or in the decision of the hearing official relative to administrative adjustments

- considered pursuant to § ZS 1-117(f) hereof. There shall be no appeal to the Board from a decision of the Planning Commission.
- (2) To determine, consistent with the provisions of § ZS 1-110(c) hereof, the boundaries of districts.
- (3) To hear and decide only such special exceptions as the Board is specifically authorized to pass on according to the provisions of this Title and to decide such questions as are involved in determining whether special exceptions should be granted.
 - A. A special exception may be granted only when the Board finds, from a preponderance of the evidence of record, that the proposed use or structure:
 - 1. Will be in conformance with the County's Comprehensive Plan.
 - 2. Will be in harmony with the general character of the neighborhood considering population density, the design, scale and bulk of any proposed new structures, the intensity and character of activity, traffic and parking conditions or the number of similar uses.
 - Will not be detrimental to the use, peaceful enjoyment, economic value or development of surrounding properties or surrounding neighborhoods; will cause no objectionable noise, vibration, fumes, odors, dust, glare or physical activity; and will not have a detrimental effect on ground- or surface water quality.
 - 4. Will have no detrimental effect on vehicular or pedestrian traffic.
 - 5. Will not adversely affect the health, safety, morals, security or general welfare of residents, workers or visitors in the area.
 - 6. Will not, in conjunction with existing development in the area and development permitted under existing zoning, overburden existing public services and facilities, including schools, police and fire protection, medical facilities, water, sanitary sewers, public roads, storm sewers, drainage and other public improvements.
 - 7. Will meet the definitions and specific standards set forth elsewhere in this Title for such use.
 - B. The applicant for a special exception shall have the burden of proof in addressing the criteria set forth in Subsection (c)(3)A hereof and the burden of providing the evidence necessary on all questions of fact which are raised by the Board.
 - C. Any special exception approved by the Board must be unconditionally accepted as approved, in writing, to the Board by the applicant requesting such use within ninety days after such special exception has been approved by the Board. Failure to so accept in writing, as herein provided, any such special exception so approved by the Board shall be considered a rejection and abandonment by the applicant of any such special exception so approved, and thereafter any such special exception so approved shall be null and void and of no effect whatsoever.

D. Unless otherwise designated by the Board, any special exception shall be implemented within twelve months from its approval. If it has not been so implemented, it shall be considered abandoned and shall terminate.

- E. In the event that any special exception which has been implemented is abandoned or ceased for a period of twelve consecutive months, it shall be considered abandoned and shall terminate.
- (4) To authorize, upon appeal, in specific cases such variances from the setback or lot area provisions of this Title as will not be contrary to the public interest where, owing to special or unique conditions, a literal enforcement of the provisions of this Title would result in unnecessary hardship of other than a financial nature.
 - A. A variance from the terms of this Title shall not be granted unless and until the applicant has demonstrated each of the following:
 - 1. Special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure or building involved.
 - 2. Literal interpretation of the provisions of this Title would deprive the applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the same district under the terms of this Title.
 - 3. The special conditions or circumstances did not result from actions of the applicant.
 - 4. The condition or circumstance is not one that could be reasonably provided for under legislation of general applicability within the zoning district and shall be granted only on account of the uniqueness of the situation.
 - B. A variance shall only be granted which modifies the setback, area or lot width provisions of this Title, and the Board shall be without authority to grant a variance which would allow a use not otherwise permitted under the terms of this Title in the district involved. The Board may not grant a variance to a definition.
 - C. Variances may be granted only for individual lots pursuant to specific applications. No blanket variance is permitted.
- (5) To grant the expansion of the area of nonconforming uses and structures upon a single lot in accordance with the provisions of § ZS 1-122 hereof.
- (6) To prescribe, in the granting of any variance, special exception or expansion of a nonconforming use or structure, appropriate conditions and safeguards in conformity with this Title and other regulations. Violations of such conditions and safeguards, when made a part of the terms under which the variance or special exception is granted, shall be deemed a violation of this Title and shall be punishable under the provisions of § ZS 1-120 hereof and, at the discretion of the Board after notice and hearing, shall be grounds for termination or revocation of the variance or special exception itself.
- (7) To reverse, affirm, wholly or in part, or modify the order and render the decision as ought to be made, the actions of the Department and to that end shall have the powers

of the Department so long as such action is in conformity with the terms of this Title.

- (8) To have continuing jurisdiction, without time limitation, over all special exceptions, variances and expansions of nonconforming uses and structures granted by the Board and may, from time to time, review such cases to ensure compliance with this Title. Should the Board find noncompliance, it may request that the Department pursue the complaint as provided in § ZS 1-111 hereof, or it may rehear the case following the procedures prescribed by this Title for an original case, including required public notice and a public hearing. Upon rehearing the case, the Board may attach additional conditions or limitations to ensure future compliance, or it may revoke the original grant and may order the special exception, variance or expansion removed and the site restored to its prior condition. A special exception, variance or expansion of a nonconformity granted by the Board shall authorize only such structures and uses as specified in the approval and is subject to all conditions or plans attached thereto. No future changes or expansion of a special exception, variance or nonconformity shall be made without the prior approval of the Board.
- (9) To require a bond to its satisfaction in cases where it deems such to be appropriate.
- (d) Who may file an appeal or application; forms; time for action; site plan.
 - (1) Applications for special exceptions, variances, expansions of a nonconformity and interpretation of district boundaries consistent with the provisions of § ZS 1-110(c) hereof may be filed only by an aggrieved governmental agency or the owner, contract purchaser, option holder or lessee of the property to be affected or by his attorney or agent. Applications filed by persons other than the property owner must be cosigned by the property owner or the property owner's attorney at law or in fact. Appeals to the Board for administrative review may be filed by any person or governmental agency who is directly aggrieved by the order, requirements, decision or determination from which the appeal is taken. Appeals and applications shall be made on forms provided by the Department. Such appeals or applications shall be acted upon within a reasonable time not to exceed ninety days or such lesser period as may be provided by the rules of the Board. Appeals and applications accompanied by the required fees as established by the County Commissioners shall be filed with the Department. In the case of appeals, the Department shall forthwith transmit to the Board all papers constituting the record upon which the action appealed from was taken.
 - A. An applicant or applicant's attorney may request for any action before the Board of Zoning Appeals a postponement of the application's consideration or for an application yet to be scheduled, its placement on inactive status. Said requests may be made at any time; however, if the request is made after the public hearing has been scheduled, the applicant or applicant's attorney shall then be responsible for the payment of any and all reasonable re-advertising and administrative costs associated with the rescheduling of the public hearing. All such requests shall be in writing. In all cases where a request for postponement of the application or a request for its placement on inactive status is not rescinded by the applicant or applicant's attorney within one year from the date the original application was submitted, the application shall be considered withdrawn in its entirety. Any

further application for any action by the Board of Zoning Appeals for the same property must be processed as an entirely new application, including the remittance of all required fees. [Added 10-17-2017 by Bill No. 17-10]

- (2) In the case of special exceptions, variances and expansions of nonconformities, every application shall be accompanied by a site plan meeting the following requirements:
 - A. Drafting standards. The site plan and all supporting drawings shall be prepared on one or more reproducible sheets. Applications with drawings larger than eleven by seventeen inches in size shall provide additional copies for review as may be required. The plan may be prepared at any conventional scale, provided that all information is clear and legible. The plan shall contain sufficient detail, labeling and dimensions to be easily understood. All lot dimensions shall be based on actual measurement or deed description. All exhibits must be easily removable from any mounting or frame. The Department may require submission of the exhibits in electronic format.
 - B. General data. The site plan shall identify the name and address of the property owner and the applicant if not the same, the general location of the property by use of an insert vicinity map, North arrow, scale, date and zoning classifications. The plan shall also bear the signatures of the applicant, the property owner or his attorney in fact or at law and bear the name of the person who prepared the site plan.
 - C. Layout. The plan shall show all property lines, structures, use areas, roads, access points, vehicular circulation, parking areas, pedestrian circulation, signs, yard setbacks, drainageways, utility lines, easements, landscaping, exterior lighting, fences, walls and other physical features. Both existing and proposed features shall be shown and labeled as such.
 - D. Elevations. The plan shall show typical schematic elevations of the major buildings and structures and of any freestanding signs. The elevations shall indicate the type of construction and basic exterior materials and color treatment.
 - E. Relationship to abutting roads and properties. The plan shall show the location of abutting roads, structures, use areas, parking lots, fences, walls, signs and other significant physical features within one hundred feet of the property line.
 - F. General description. Accompanying the site plan shall be a written description of the project and its intended use or operation. Such description shall be typed on sheets eight and one-half by eleven inches in size.
- (3) The Board may waive any of the requirements cited in Subsection (d)(2) hereof where it finds them nonessential for rendering its decision. The Board may adopt policies to be used for waivers. The Board or Department may require such additional data, drawings or documentation as it deems necessary to adequately review the application for compliance with the intent and provisions of this Title. The Board may continue any case in order to obtain additional data, drawings or documentation.
- (4) The Board's granting of a special exception, variance or expansion of a nonconforming

use or structure shall authorize, without deviation, only the uses and structures as shown on the site plan as approved, including any modifications that the Board may have incorporated in its approval. Deviation from such approved site plan or attached modifications shall be considered a violation of this Title.

- (e) <u>Hearing</u>; notice. The Board shall fix a reasonable time for the hearing of appeals and applications, consistent with its rules of practice and procedure. Public notice shall be given by the Board for all hearings relating to zoning matters in accordance with the procedures set forth in § ZS 1-114 hereof.
- (f) <u>Calendar of the Board.</u> A calendar of the Board showing the times and dates of hearings relating to zoning matters shall be maintained and posted in a conspicuous location in the office of the Department. The Board shall assure that a current copy of the calendar is provided to the Planning Commission.
- (g) Advice of Planning Commission.
 - (1) The Board shall provide the Planning Commission with a copy of its agenda at least fifteen days prior to each of its meetings. The Planning Commission may comment on or appear at the hearing on any matter pending before the Board. Such comments shall be considered by the Board but shall not be binding upon the Board.
 - (2) The Board may request from the Planning Commission or Technical Review Committee such technical service, data or factual evidence as will further assist the Board in reaching decisions, and any such information forwarded by the Planning Commission shall be incorporated into the public record and shall be made available to the applicant if requested.
- (h) Stay of proceedings. An appeal to the Board shall stay all proceedings, time requirements and approval periods by all agencies and by all persons affected by the action appealed from, including the applicant, unless the Department certifies to the Board that, by reason of facts stated in the certificate, a stay would, in the Department's opinion, cause imminent peril to life or property, in which case the Board may, by written order, permit such proceedings to go forward, in whole or in part, under such restrictions as the Board may deem appropriate. This section shall not be construed to permit the continuance of any action constituting or compounding a violation hereof, it being the intent that all agencies and persons, including the applicant and the Department, involved in the matter cease all actions affecting the same (unless exception is made as herein provided) until the Board has decided the matter.
- (i) Repeated application for special exception, variance or expansion of nonconforming use or structure. No application for a special exception, variance or expansion of a nonconforming use or structure shall be accepted by the Department if the application is for substantially the same proposal on the same property as an application denied by the Board within the previous twelve months as measured from the date of the Board's vote for denial. However, the Board may allow an applicant to withdraw an application at any time, provided that, if the request for withdrawal is made after publication of the notice of public hearing, no similar application shall be allowed within twelve months following the date of such withdrawal. The Board may specify by formal resolution that the time limitation shall not apply in such cases where the Board finds that the applicant is unable to attend the advertised hearing for

any of the following reasons:

- (1) A death in the immediate family of the applicant or his/her attorney.
- (2) A serious illness on the part of the applicant or his/her attorney which requires the treatment or supervision of a medical doctor.
- (3) The incarceration or criminal detention of the applicant or his/her attorney.
- (4) Any other like circumstance that the Board determines to be of such a serious nature as to prohibit the attendance of the applicant or his/her attorney.
- (j) Limitation of authority of Board.
 - (1) Nothing contained in this section shall be deemed to authorize the Board to reverse or modify any refusal of a permit or any other order, requirement, decision or determination which conforms to the provisions of this Title and which is therefore not erroneous or to authorize the Board to validate, ratify or legalize any violation of law or of the provisions of this Title.
 - (2) The Board shall not amend any of the provisions of this Title, including the Official Zoning Maps, except as specifically authorized in Subsection (c)(2) hereof.
- (k) <u>Powers with respect to forest conservation matters.</u> The Board shall have only the following powers and functions:
 - (1) To hear and decide appeals from an applicant where it is alleged that there is an error in the application of the law (but not in discretionary judgment), in any order, requirement, decision or determination made by the Department in the administration or enforcement of the Worcester County Forest Conservation Law.¹
 - (2) To hear and decide applications from an applicant for adjustments and exceptions to the requirements of the Worcester County Forest Conservation Law in accordance with the provisions thereof.
 - (3) Decisions of the Board with respect to such matters shall be made after a hearing following the same procedures established for a zoning case in Subsections (d)(2) and (d)(3) and Subsections (e), (g), (h) and (i) hereof.
- (1) Powers with respect to the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area. In accordance with the provisions of § NR 3-211 of the Worcester County Natural Resources Article, as from time to time amended, the Board shall have the power to authorize upon appeal in specific cases variances to the terms of the Natural Resources Article of the Code of Public Local Laws of Worcester County, Maryland, NR3, Subtitle NR3:II, Worcester County Chesapeake Bay Critical Area Ordinance.
- (m) <u>Powers with respect to the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area.</u> The Board shall have only the following powers and functions with respect to the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area:

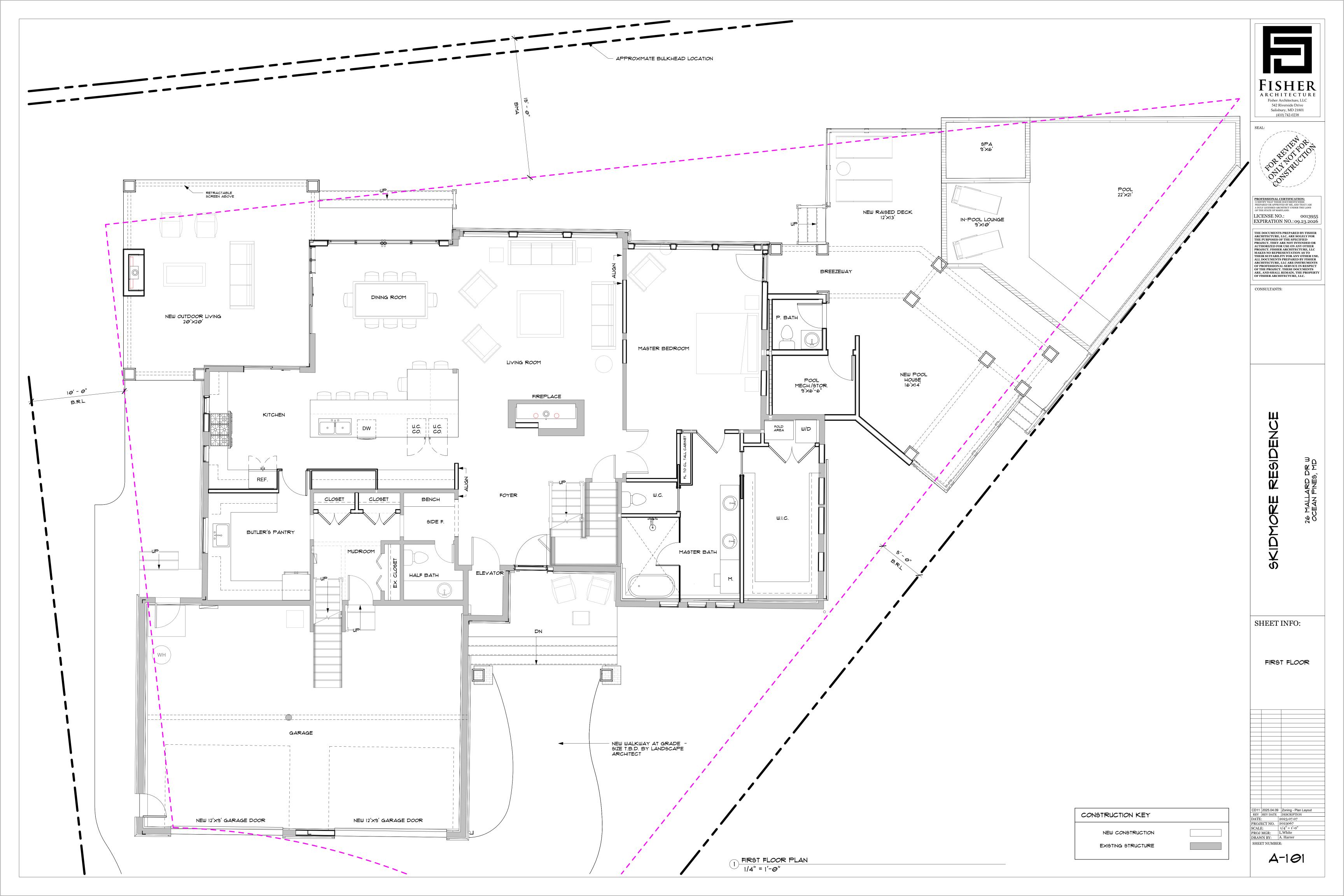
(1) In accordance with the provisions of § NR 3-111 of the Worcester County Natural Resources Article, as from time to time amended, the Board shall have the power to authorize upon appeal in specific cases variances to the terms of the Natural Resources Article of the Code of Public Local Laws of Worcester County, Maryland, NR3, Subtitle NR3:I, Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area Ordinance.

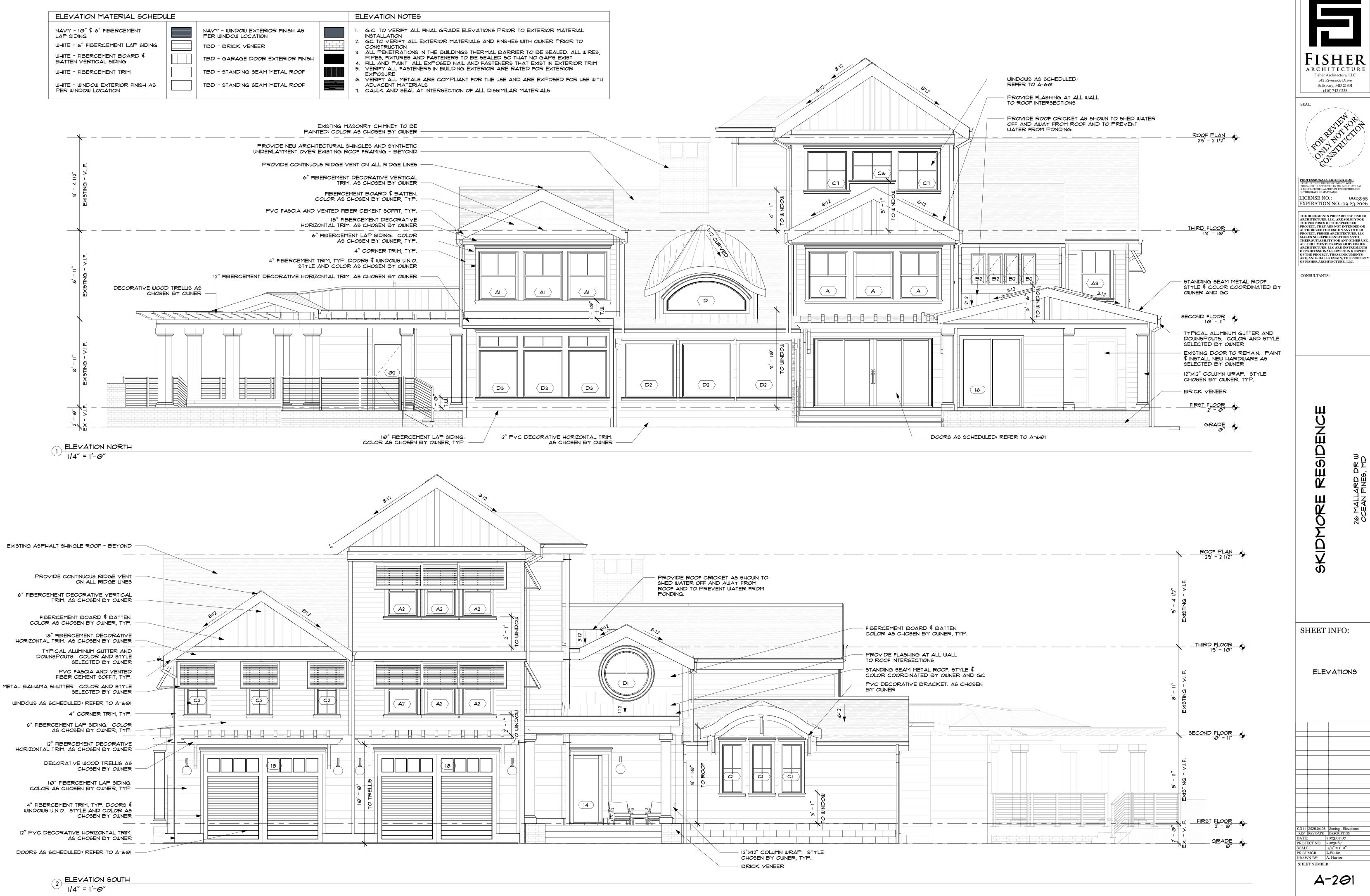
- (2) In accordance with the provisions of any buffer management plans adopted by resolution of the County Commissioners in accordance with the provisions of the Natural Resources Article of the Code of Public Local Laws of Worcester County, Maryland, Title 3, Subtitle I, Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area Ordinance, the Board shall have the power to review the decision of the Department with respect to the denial of requests for payment in lieu for required mitigation or bufferyard establishment.
- (n) <u>Powers with respect to construction along shorelines</u>. The Board shall have only the following powers and functions with respect to construction along shorelines: [Added 9-15-2015 by Bill No. 15-10]
 - (1) In accordance with § NR 2-102(h)(1) of the Natural Resources Article of the Code of Public Local Laws of Worcester County, Maryland, as from time to time amended, the Board shall only have the power to hear and decide appeals where it is alleged that there is an error in the application of the law (but not in discretionary judgment) in any requirement, decision or determination made by the Department or Approval Authority charged with administration of construction along shorelines as specified in § NR 2-102 relative to any application for shoreline construction. In considering such an appeal and making a decision the Board shall make specific findings of fact with regard to the Department's or Approval Authority's decision on the application relative to the following: environmental impact; navigational impact; recreational potential; commercial benefit to Worcester County; the impact of the proposed construction upon the surrounding neighborhood and upon property values therein; and such other matters as the Board may consider appropriate and germane to the issue.
 - (2) To authorize modifications to the limitations on the extension of waterfront structures into a body of water pursuant to § NR 2-102(e)(1), as from time to time amended.
 - (3) To authorize modifications to the minimum separation requirement of waterfront structures to adjoining property lines pursuant to § NR 2-102(e)(2), as from time to time amended

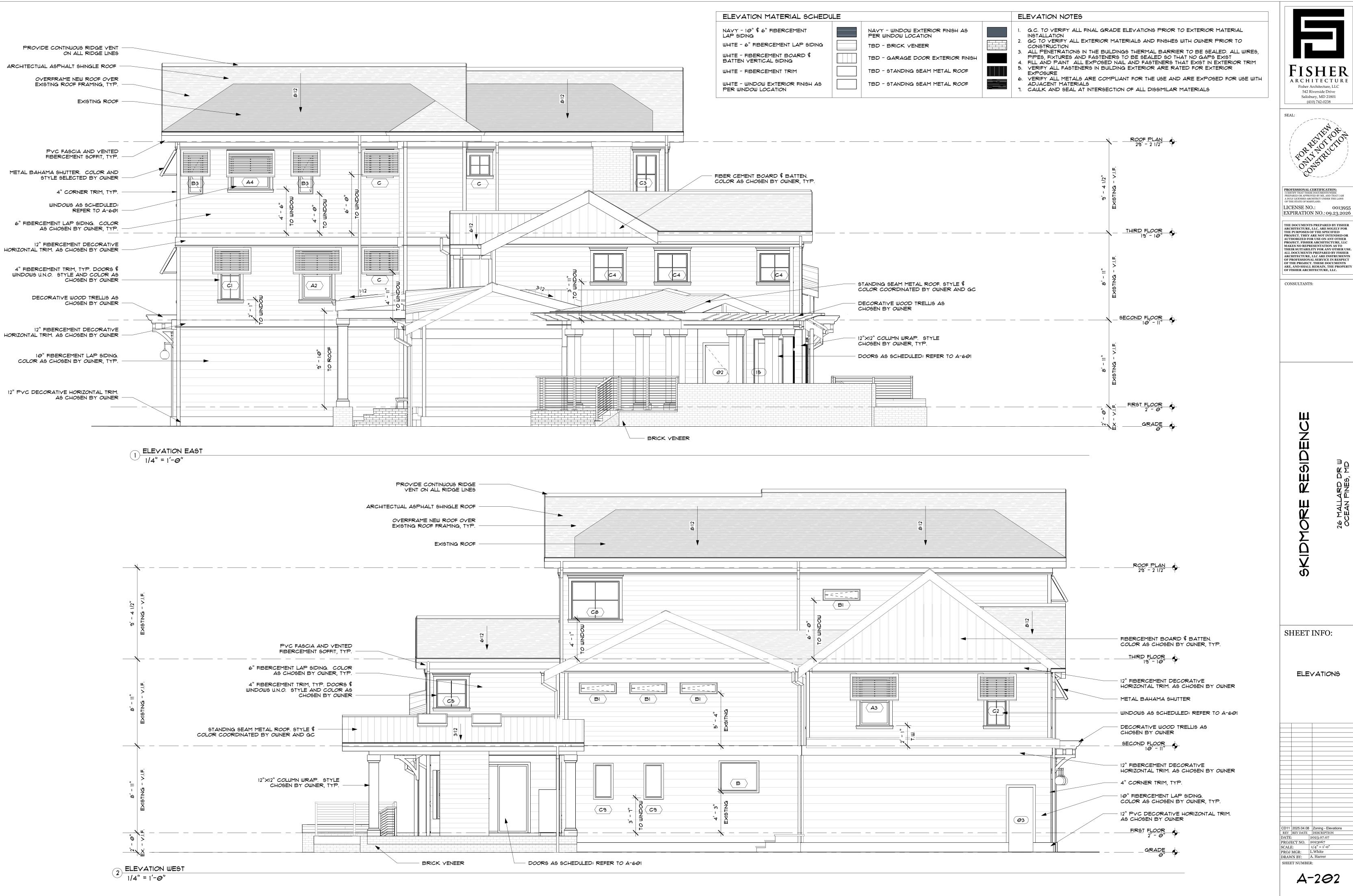

I represent Nicholas Campanaro and Danielle Campanaro, his wife, owners of Lot 15, one of the few remaining undeveloped lots in the Stray Fox Subdivision.

Lot 15 was originally designated on a Plat entitled "Record Plat, Stray Fox Subdivision, Third Election District, Worcester County, Maryland" made by Soule & Associates, Property Line Surveyor No. 450, of the State of Maryland, dated April, 1994, and recorded among the Land Records of Worcester County, Maryland, in Plat Book RHO No. 139, Folios 57, et. seq. The effective date of the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area Law (subsequently combined with the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area Law) was June 1, 2002. Therefore, the creation of this lot predates the effect of the Critical Area Law by many years.

A copy of the proposed Site Plan is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

The relevant portion of the original Subdivision Plat is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

Lot 15 is unique by virtue of the fact that the Septic Reserve Area, or SRA, is located directly in the center of the lot. The other waterfront lots, Lots 11, 12, 13, and 14 all have the SRA's adjacent to Trappe Creek Drive.

Lots 16 and 17, adjoining to the northwest, are much larger lots, with larger building envelopes.

Lot 15 is also unique by virtue of the orientation of the shoreline, being triangular in shape at its intersection with Trappe Creek.

The utilization of Lot 15 is very unique in that the Stray Fox Subdivision is built out, and the vast majority of the homes were constructed **prior** to the effective date of the Critical Area Law. As such, they were subject to a 50 foot shoreline protection setback. As the proposed Site Plan demonstrates, the neighboring home on Lot 16 is approximately 58 feet from the mean high water line, and the majority of the house is located in the 100 foot Critical Area Buffer.

This is a variance to authorize a modest sized single family dwelling encroaching into the 100 foot Critical Area Buffer. Although a small lot, the allowable lot coverage is 9,310 sq, ft. The applicant has proposed 7,289 sq. ft. in lot coverage, well below the permitted minimum.

The proposed square footage in the buffer is 1,150 sq. ft., which is a minimal impact.

1. Due to special features of the site or special conditions or circumstances peculiar to the applicant's land or structure, a literal enforcement of the local Critical Area program would result in an unwarranted hardship to the applicant.

Lot 15, and the entirety of the Stray Fox Subdivision, is zoned E-1, Estate District. A copy of the Worcester County statute is attached, and single family dwellings are permitted by Section ZS 1-203(b)(4).

Specific hardship/non-conformity is the fact that the minimum lot requirement in an E-1 Zoning District is 80,000 sq. ft., and Lot 15 is actually 62,064 sq. ft.

The minimum lot width is 200 ft., and the width of Lot 15 is 130 feet.

The front yard setback in an E-1 Zoning District is 50 feet.

Each side yard setback in the E-1 Zoning District is 50 feet, which completely consumes this 130 feet wide lot.

The rear yard setback is 50 feet, which is inapplicable in light of the 100 foot Critical Area Buffer, and the fact that the rear of the lot is platted as a Forest Conservation Easement.

Given the drainage and utility easement in the front yard, as well as the 50 foot front yard setback, it is impossible to locate the house northeast, or landward of the platted SRA.

The only buildable area on the lot is behind, or channelward of the SRA.

This property is unique in that the SRA was expanded in 2009.

According to Worcester County Environmental Programs, the highest and most well drained soils (which is also evident from the topo on the proposed Site Plan), would be on the southwesterly, or channelward portion of the lot. Therefore, this creates a hardship.

The property owner attempted to move the SRA closer to Trappe Creek Drive, and this request was denied.

The special features of the site and special conditions and circumstances particular to this land, have left only one building envelope, and the house is situated so as to reduce impacts.

Arguably, the house could be shifted in an easterly direction, towards Lot 14, but it would be impossible to accomplish a turn radius to get into the garage. The house would have to be pushed further channelward. Also, this scenario would provide even more lot coverage which the property owner is attempting to avoid.

This property presents a definite hardship, warranting the Critical Area Variance. Without the Critical Area Variance, the applicants would be denied reasonable and significant use of the entire lot.

2. A literal interpretation of the local Critical Area program would deprive the applicant of a use of land or a structure permitted to others in accordance with the provisions of the local Critical Area program.

This is the last remaining undeveloped waterfront lot in the Stray Fox Subdivision. Most of the houses in this subdivision were built prior to the effect of the Critical Area Law.

For example, the neighboring home on Lot 16 is located approximately 58 feet from the mean high water line, encroaching 42 feet into the Critical Area Buffer.

As described previously, Lots 11, 12, 13, and 14 enjoy generous building envelopes, because the SRA's are located adjacent to Trappe Creek Drive.

In the case of Lot 15, the SRA is located in the center of the lot, to accommodate the higher and more well drained soils.

The property owner applied to move the SRA adjacent to Trappe Creek Drive, like the other properties, and the request was denied due to the quality of the soils.

The applicants have proposed a modest sized home, and in every case it appears to be smaller than the other waterfront homes in this subdivision, or even the other interior homes for that matter.

Without the requested variance, the applicants will be denied a reasonable and significant use of the entire property, and will be deprived of rights enjoyed by other property owners.

3. The granting of the variance would not confer upon the applicant any special privilege that would be denied by the local Critical Area program to other lands or structures in accordance with the provisions of the local Critical Area program.

Lot 15 is a platted, approved, and recorded building lot. It is zoned E-1, Estate District, which is a residential zoning, with a residential tax assessment. Single family dwellings and accessories are permitted by zoning. Lot 15 is located in a Limited Development Area or LDA. The lot has an existing Septic Reserve Area, or SRA. The property is located in the Stray Fox Subdivision, which is largely built out, except for this lot.

The granting of this variance is necessary to build a modest sized single family dwelling, and certainly would not confer a special privilege or right to the applicants.

4. The variance request is not based upon conditions or circumstances that are the result of actions by the applicant.

This is not an after-the-fact variance. The property was originally platted in 1994, prior to the enactment of the Critical Area Law, which was effective June 1, 2002.

The unique angle of the shoreline did not result from actions of the applicants, and it has created a hardship. The 100 foot Buffer imposes disproportionately on the northwest side of the lot.

The non-conforming size of the lot per zoning, in every respect, the unique configuration of the shoreline, the location of the SRA directly in the center of the lot, the utility easement in the front of the lot, and other conditions did not result from the actions of the applicants.

5. The variance request does not arise from any conforming or non-conforming condition on any neighboring property.

This request does not arise from any conditions relating to land or building use on any neighboring property. In fact, all of the other waterfront lots in this community are built out, and have existed for many years.

6. The granting of the variance would not adversely affect water quality or adversely impact fish, wildlife, or plant habitat within the jurisdiction's local Critical Area.

The proposed Site Plan in this case has a modest sized single family dwelling and represents a minimal intrusion, while providing the applicants with reasonable use and enjoyment of their property. Due to the angle of the shoreline at Trappe Creek, the 100 foot Buffer has a disproportionate impact on this property.

The proposed dwelling will only provide 1,150 sq. ft. of lot coverage within the Buffer, and there will still be a large Buffer available for mitigation. The mitigation will certainly outweigh any negative impacts of this proposed construction, and will improve water quality.

Currently, the majority of the 100 foot Buffer is mowed grass, probably mowed well into the Forest Conservation Easement by prior owners. The re-establishment of the Buffer will have a very positive impact on water quality.

7. The granting of the variance would be in harmony with the general spirit and intent of the Critical Area Law.

In conclusion, this is the last undeveloped lot in the Stray Fox Subdivision, and probably one of the last undeveloped lots in the entire area. Lot 15 is unique by virtue of the angle of the shoreline, the SRA being located in the center of the lot, the lot being non-conforming under the Zoning Code in every respect, and a front yard utility easement, among other things.

The property is zoned E-1 Estate District, a residential zoning, it is designated LDA, it is part of a platted residential subdivision, with a residential tax assessment, and will be served by an approved SRA.

The failure to grant this small buffer impact would represent an unwarranted hardship, and deprive the applicants use and enjoyment of their entire property.

The proposed use is probably less impactful than all of the other waterfront homes in this community, and the establishment of a Buffer Management Plan will improve water quality, and the applicants respectfully request that their Critical Area Variance be granted.

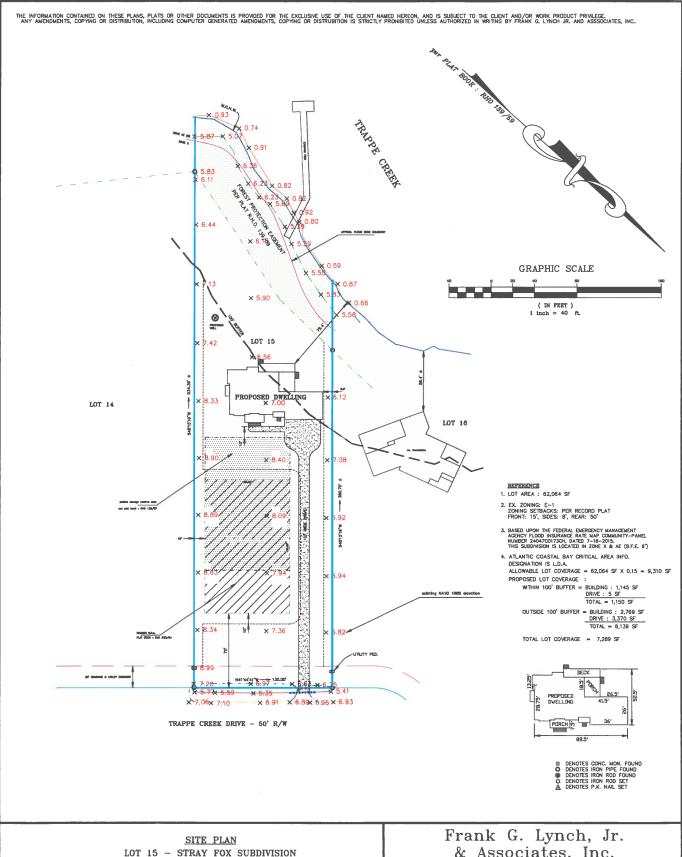

The following comments are provided for the above referenced case as related to the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Are Law:

This variance request before the Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) is for a property located within the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area. The property is identified as the lands of Nicholas & Danielle Campanaro, Tax Map 32, Parcel 349, Lot 15, Trappe Creek Drive, Berlin, MD 21811. The property is more specifically located within the Limited Development Area (LDA) designation with an associated 100' buffer.

The Applicants are requesting a variance to δNR 3-104(c) (4) of the Worcester County Code of Public Local Laws in order to gain authorization to construct a Single-Family Dwelling and accessories within the 100' buffer.

The Critical Area "[b]uffer shall be established at a minimum distance of one hundred feet landward from the mean high-water line of tidal waters" as stated in δNR 3-104(c)(1). Under δNR 3-104(c) (4) of the County Code, "[n]ew development activities including structures . . . and other impervious surfaces may not be allowed in the Buffer". Under δNR 3-111(c) of the County Code, "[A]pplications for a variance shall be made in writing to the Board of Zoning Appeals".

Under δ NR 3-111 "A Critical Area Program variance may be granted . . . where, owing to special features of a site or other circumstances, implementation of this Program or a literal enforcement of provisions within the Program would result in unwarranted hardship to an applicant".

Under the Code of Maryland (COMAR) 27.01.12.06, Worcester County may not accept an application for a variance to legalize a violation of this subtitle, including an unpermitted structure or other development activity, until the County issues a notice of violation and assesses an administrative or civil penalty for the violation.

As the Board is aware, from previous variances to the Critical Area Law, all applicants must address six standards. The Critical Area Law requires that each of the six standards for a variance be met before the Board renders a decision.

STAFF ANALYSIS

The six standards for Variance, as listed in δNR 3-111(b) (1) thru (6) of the County Code, will be addressed below.

1) Special conditions or circumstances exist that are peculiar to the applicant's land or structure, and a literal enforcement of provisions and requirements of the County's Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area Program would result in unwarranted hardship.

Staff agrees that without the granting of this variance a potential hardship could exist. This property was platted prior to the adoption of the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area Program. The property is not located within a Buffer Management Area, which would have reduced the impact to the 100' Buffer. Without granting this variance a potential hardship could exist by inhibiting them from constructing a home on the property.

2) A literal interpretation of the provisions of the County's Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area Program and related laws will deprive the applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in similar areas within the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area.

Staffs opinion would be that the applicant's rights could be lessened without the granting of this variance due to the restrictions of the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area Program. Numerous properties within the Critical Area, including the adjacent lot, have structures that are located within the 100' buffer.

(3) The granting of a variance will not confer upon an applicant any special privilege that would be denied by the County's Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area Program to other lands or structures within the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area.

As stated previously, there are numerous properties throughout the County and within this subdivision have structures located within the 100' buffer. Since this subdivision was platted prior to the adoption of the Critical Area program, provisions were not provided during the subdivision review process which could have lessened these buffer requirements. Therefore, granting this variance would not present a special right or privilege to the applicant.

(4) The variance request is not based upon conditions or circumstances which are the result of actions by the applicant nor does the request arise from any condition relating to land or building use, either permitted or non-conforming on any neighboring property.

This request is not an after-the-fact variance, and this property was platted prior to the adoption of the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area program.

(5) The granting of a variance shall not adversely affect water quality or adversely impact fish, wildlife or plant habitat within the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area and the granting of the variance will be in harmony with the general spirit and intent of the County's Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Program.

While the granting of this variance could slightly affect the water quality due to the proposed impact to the 100' buffer, actions will be taken to offset this issue. If approved the proposed activity will be required to conduct mitigation at a 3:1 ratio for the area disturbed within the 100' buffer. Furthermore, compliance with Stormwater/Erosion Sediment Control regulations will be required for disturbance 5,000 square feet or greater and/or use of 100 cubic yards or greater of fill.

(6) The Board of Zoning Appeals shall not make a decision relative to a request for such a variance without reviewing the comments of the Department and finding that the applicant has satisfied each of the provisions and standards contained herein.

Staff agrees that the applicant does have an unwarranted hardship due to the 100' buffer. The Board should consider additional testimony before determining that the applicant has adequately addressed and met the standards required for a variance.

ADDITIONAL STAFF COMMENTS

State Critical Area Commission staff has also reviewed this request and have provided comments. Critical Area Commission Natural Resources Planner, Kathryn Hayden, stated in her August 26, 2025 letter:

"Further, granting the variance in it current form would confer a special privilege, as it would allow construction within the buffer where it is not necessary and where reasonable redesign can avoid or significantly reduce such impacts."

The Commission also requests that they be informed by writing of the decision rendered by the Board for this case.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff agrees that without this variance an unwarranted hardship could exist; however, there are areas of the proposed construction that could be reduced or modified to lessen the impacts to the 100' buffer. There are numerous properties located throughout the County, and within this subdivision that have legally existing structures that encroach into the 100' buffer. Also, due to the fact that this lot was platted prior to the adoption of the Critical Area regulations, without a variance, the applicant rights could be lessened and result in a potential hardship.

Should the Board of Zoning Appeals grant the variance, the Department feels that there should be a condition placed on the site that requires full compliance with the 3:1 mitigation requirement. This mitigation will be based upon the amount of disturbance and lot coverage that occurs within the buffer. It should also be subject to the condition that the Applicant agrees to and enters upon a Critical Area Planting Agreement as required by δNR 3-111(e) (1). The Applicant would also be required to submit a planting plan and work with Staff to satisfy this requirement. Mitigation shall be conducted within the buffer first with the balance installed at other places onsite. If total amount mitigation cannot be planted onsite, provisions exist to allow for offsite planting and/or fee-in-lieu.

Thank you for submitting the above referenced variance application to our office for review. The applicant is requesting a variance to the provisions of the Worcester County Critical Area Code to permit the construction of a single-family dwelling partially within the Critical Area Buffer. The property is located along Trappe Creek Drive in Berlin MD, 21811 within the Stray Fox Subdivision. The plat was recorded before the Worcester County Critical Area Program. The entire 62,064 square foot property is within the Critical Area on land designated Limited Development Area (LDA). Portions of the property are also within the Critical Area Buffer. The proposed lot coverage is 7,289 square feet, which is within the allowable limit for a lot of this size. The location of the proposed single family dwelling is limited by a septic reserve area in the center of the lot, and, in the front yard, a 50 foot setback as well as a drainage and utility easement. If approved, the development would result in 1,150 square feet of new lot coverage in the Buffer.

We note that in order for a variance be granted, the Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) must find that the applicant has satisfied the burden of proof and persuasion that each and every one of the Critical Area variance standards under COMAR 27.01.12 has been met, including unwarranted hardship. Furthermore, State law establishes the presumption that a proposed activity for which a Critical Area variance is requested does not conform to the purpose and intent of the Critical Area law and County's Critical Area Program. The BZA must make an affirmative finding that the applicant has overcome this presumption, based on the competent and substantial evidence presented from the applicant. This office recognizes the site constraints limiting the buildable area and the applicants desire to keep the garage situated where it's currently proposed partially in the Buffer to accomplish a turn radius to get into the garage.

However, the variance standards require more than demonstrating inconvenience. The standard of *unwarranted hardship* requires that denial of the variance would effectively deprive the applicant of a reasonable and significant use of the entire parcel or lot for which the variance is requested. In this case, the applicant has reasonable alternatives available to either redesign or further reduce impacts to the Buffer—including relocating the deck and porch to the southeastern

side of the property outside the Buffer as shown in the attached image or otherwise modifying the footprint of the dwelling to reduce encroachment. Given the availability of such design alternatives, the applicant cannot demonstrate that denial of the variance would result in unwarranted hardship.

Further, granting the variance in its current form would confer a *special privilege*, as it would allow construction within the Buffer where it is not necessary and where reasonable redesign can avoid or significantly reduce such impacts. This would not amount to the denial of a right commonly allowed to others under the Critical Area Program, since the law requires applicants to first exhaust alternatives that avoid or minimize impacts - including seeking other variance requests before seeking relief through a Critical Area variance.

For these reasons, it does not appear that the proposal as currently designed meets each and every one of the variance standards. Specifically, there remains opportunity to reduce or eliminate Buffer impacts entirely, and the request as submitted does not overcome the presumption of nonconformance to the purpose and intent of the Critical Area Program. Doing so will better align this proposal with the spirit and intent of the Critical Area laws, regulations, and the Worcester County Critical Area Program.

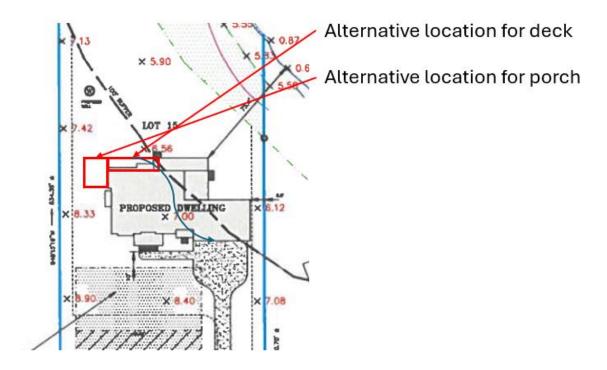

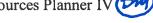

6:30 pm - Case # 25-53:

This request is located within the landward limits of the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area and therefore exempt from the Forest Conservation Act. No comment.

6:35 pm -Case # 25-54:

This request is located within the landward limits of the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area and therefore exempt from the Forest Conservation Act. No comment.

6:40 pm -Case # 25-56:

For land areas over 40,000 square feet and located outside the landward limits of Critical Area, any project requiring disturbance of 5,000 square feet or greater, or subdivision creating new lot(s), shall require compliance with the Worcester County Forest Conservation Law. To obtain compliance, the owner/applicant is required to have a Qualified Professional (approved by Maryland Department of Natural Resources), Licensed Landscape Architect, or Licensed Forester, prepare a Forest Stand Delineation and a Forest Conservation Plan for review and approval by the Department. This Department will reserve further comments until permit submission.
