We received word from Chief of the Civil Project Development Branch for the Baltimore Corps District that the attached letter the County Commissioners approved of at the January 2025 meeting needs to be refreshed for their budget. Their typical process is for the Baltimore District to put together a budget request package, which needs to include a letter of interest from a potential sponsor - like the one attached. The budget the District is working on now is for FY28 (starting Oct 2027). They could not get this approved in their Corps FY 27 budget request.

This letter will be used for us to try to get funds in the FY26-27 workplan. The Corps workplan is a list of projects that may get funded if Congress adds additional money in the program that is not otherwise directed toward a specific project. The local Civil Branch Division leader for the Corps requested this updated letter. They would again push to get an update of the 1998 OC Water Resources study going so they can look at all the issues – Flooding, Navigation, storm resilience, and ecosystem restoration.

I have attached the prior letter we sent, and I can work with Administration to prepare a new letter.

So again, I would respectfully request the County Commissioners consider expressing interest in the intent to initiate a study partnership to address an update of the prior study to review the increasing water resource issues in the inlet and the opportunities for solutions. The letter would be the same as the prior letter with a new date.

The Worcester County Commissioners would like to update the 1998 *Ocean City, Maryland, and Vicinity, Water Resources Study, Feasibility Report and Integrated Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)*. Navigation and physical environment conditions have notably changed in the Ocean City Inlet since the recommendations included in the original study, and shoaling impacts are increasing at an alarming rate since Hurricane Sandy in 2012.

We write on behalf of Worcester County to express our willingness to participate as the sponsor for the update of the 1998 Water Resources Study in partnership with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). Our partnership will provide an opportunity for us to cooperatively conduct an update of the prior ecosystem restoration feasibility study and an integrated environmental assessment for the inlet. Worcester County understands that a study cannot be initiated unless it is selected as a New Start study with associated allocation of federal funds provided through the annual congressional appropriations process. If selected, we intend to sign a Feasibility Cost Sharing Agreement (FCSA) to initiate the study with USACE which targets completion of the feasibility study within three years.

After signing the FCSA, a Project Management Plan will be developed and agreed upon by Worcester County, our local and state partners and USACE. The study will be conducted and managed by USACE. The cost-share for the study is based on a 50 percent contribution by the federal government with local and state partners providing 50 percent contribution provided in cash or by a combination of cash and in-kind services. This letter constitutes only an expression of intent to initiate a study partnership to address the specified water resources problems and is not a contractual obligation.

Citizens and Government Working Together

We acknowledge and understand that work on the study cannot commence until it is included in the administration's budget request, until funds are appropriated by congress, and until an FCSA is signed. Likewise, our participation as the sponsor of the study is subject to state and local funding appropriations. It is also our understanding that we or USACE may opt to discontinue the study at any time after the FCSA is signed. If it is determined that additional time or funding is necessary to support decisions to be made in order to complete the study, Worcester County and our local and state partners will work with USACE to determine the appropriate course of action.

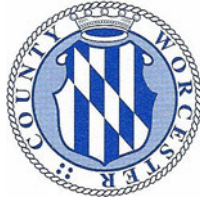

WASTEWATER AND/OR WATER AGREEMENT
Reference PW5-307 Code of Public Local Laws of Worcester County

THIS AGREEMENT made this 16 day of January, 2026, by and between THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WORCESTER COUNTY, MARYLAND, in the capacity of the governing body of _____, hereinafter called "Service Area" and Buas Hill House, LLC, hereinafter called "Developer." The parties hereto do hereby agree as follows:

A. PROJECT Utility plan for 9533 Stephen Decatur Highway hereinafter called "Facilities."

B. LOCATION PROPERTY

Properties affected by this agreement are more particularly described as follows:

Deed Reference 8312/60 Tax Map 26 Parcel 274 Lot 1-C

C. SERVICE TO BE PROVIDED 1 1/2" Sanitary Sewer Service and 1" Water Service

D. LEGAL REQUIREMENTS AND PROCEDURE

Developer shall:

1. Upon the execution hereof, deed to Service Area, free and clear of all liens and encumbrances, by special warranty deed: all fee simple parcels and easements required for the operation and construction of Facilities and provide an acceptable title certificate signed by a Maryland attorney.
2. Provide plans as required by Service Area which must be satisfactory to Service Area prior to commencement of construction.
3. In cooperation with Service Area, secure all necessary permits for the benefit of Service Area and transfer the same to the Service Area.
4. Provide any construction bond required by applicable law regulation.
5. Commence construction of Facilities by _____ complete construction by June 2026 and Construct Facilities to the satisfaction of Service Area in accordance with all required permits to all applicable standards as established by Service Area.
6. Upon completion of Facilities and final inspection, approval and acceptance by the Service Area transfer all portions of the Facilities not already property of the Service Area free and clear of all liens and encumbrances at which time Service Area shall assume operational control of the Facilities.
7. Post such cash deposits as required by Service Area to provide for operation for not less than one year of operational costs of Facilities.
8. Provide lien releases or evidence of full and final payment to all contractors, engineers and suppliers as required by Service Area.
9. Warrant the construction and performance of Facilities for a period of not less than two years from the date of acceptance by the Service Area.

10. Post a maintenance bond in amounts to guarantee the warranty. Such bond shall be equal to 50% of actual cost of all equipment. Further provide that Service Area may set amounts of such bonds within the parameters hereof.

E. SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS None.

F. CONSTRUCTION AGREEMENTS

1. Developer shall construct Facilities at Developer's sole expense subject to the oversight of Service Area.
2. Developer shall make all corrections, additions, and adjustments required by Service Area to complete construction of Facilities according to all permits, plans and specifications.
3. Service Area may reject unsatisfactory work in which case it shall be redone by Developer.

G. CHARGES, COSTS, FEES AND EXPENSES

1. Developer shall pay all costs, fees and expenses of Service Area in performing of this agreement including without limitation, permit fees and costs incurred by Service Area in processing and oversight of the construction of Facilities. Those fees are costs are estimated to be \$1,500.00
2. A deposit in escrow for costs, fees and expenses of Service Area in the amount of \$24,900.00 shall be made by Developer upon signing and such account maintained as required by Service Area pending acceptance by Service Area.
3. Upon completion and acceptance of the Facilities and the commencement of operation thereof, Developer shall commence payment of standard charges imposed within the service area in which the service is provided.

H. EXCESS CAPACITY-OWNED BY SERVICE AREA

1. Facilities are designed and intended to serve 9533 Stephen Decatur Highway, Ocean City MD 21842
2. Any excess capacity of Facilities or of any modification or addition thereto shall be the property of Service Area and shall belong to Service Area. There shall be no recoupment of costs of construction, expenses, fees, operation or installation of Facilities by Developer unless as specifically set forth herein or in a separate written agreement between the parties.

I. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

1. In any action brought in court under this agreement the, jurisdiction venue shall be exclusively the Circuit Court of Worcester County, Maryland.
2. The provisions of this agreement shall be governed and construed according to the laws of the State of Maryland. The parties' performance of obligations hereunder shall comply with all applicable governmental requirements. Existing and future laws shall supersede this agreement. It is entered into pursuant to Section PW 5-307 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Worcester County.
3. The construction of Facilities pursuant hereto shall constitute an offer of dedication to the County Commissioners of Worcester County for the benefit of Service Area.
4. This agreement shall constitute an encumbrance on lands described in Paragraph B hereof and shall run with the land.

5. Developer and Service Area agree to cooperate in the implementation of this agreement and agree to execute such other and further assurances or additional documents and instruments as it may be reasonably required of or requested by the other party to carry out the provisions hereof.
6. The rights, obligations and duties of Service Area hereunder are delegated (subject to revocation) to the Worcester County Department of Public Works.
7. The Service Area is a governmental body and shall be entitled to all immunities and nothing herein shall negate any governmental entities.
8. All documents executed pursuant hereto shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney for Worcester County, acting on behalf of Service Area.

Public Works is requesting Commissioner approval of an over-expenditure at the Solid Waste, Recycling Division for the Overtime Pay account, 100.1206.6000.400 in the amount of \$5,500.00. On November 21, 2025, the baling machine in the Recycling Division broke down and was out of service until December 18, 2025. During that time, paper and cardboard became backed up to the point it was overflowing out of the doors of the Recycling building. With the overflow of material and the increase of cardboard from the holiday, 4 to 6 person crews were working 10-hour days to catch up.

Headway has been made on cardboard to the point the compactor and loading dock can now be accessed allowing the shipment out of the baled cardboard. If approved, the over-expenditure request would allow two more weeks of overtime, including Saturdays. The increased hours will allow crews to get caught up with the excess cardboard and paper.

Funds are available in the Recycling account – 100.1206. 6110.420, Tools and Supplies to cover this over-expenditure. Please let me know if there are any questions.

Mr. Young,

On behalf of Sheriff Matthew Crisafulli, the Sheriff's Office respectfully requests approval to proceed with the FY26 purchase of a pneumatic breaching tool in the amount of \$38,230.78. This purchase was included in the budget amendment approved by the Worcester County Commissioners during the December 2, 2025 meeting, and funds have been transferred to General Ledger Account 100.1101.030.6110.190 (Supplies & Equipment – Law Enforcement Equipment) to fully cover the cost.

The Worcester County Sheriff's Office worked in coordination with Mr. Ed Welch, Worcester County Procurement Officer, to secure pricing through a publicly solicited cooperative contract. The equipment is manufactured by Holmatro, Inc., which holds a proprietary design for this technology and distributes through an assigned geographic dealer network. Chesapeake Fire & Rescue Equipment, Inc. is the authorized Holmatro dealer servicing Worcester County. This procurement was sourced through cooperative contract #PS25710, resulting in a 2% discount and satisfying formal competitive bid requirements and Worcester County financial policy.

The pneumatic breaching tool is a tactical device designed to provide rapid, controlled forced entry into locked or barricaded doors and other entry points using compressed air. This capability enhances operational safety and efficiency during high-risk law-enforcement activities, including warrant service and exigent circumstances.



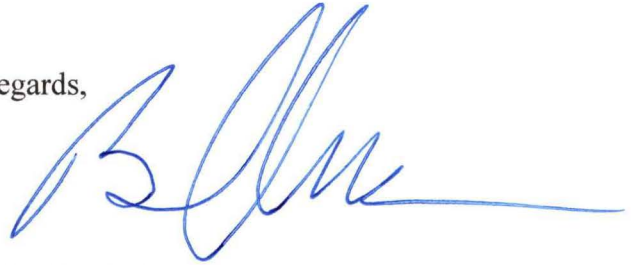

To the best of our knowledge, no other law-enforcement agency on the eastern side of the Chesapeake Bay currently possesses equipment of this type. Upon completion of required training, this tool will also be made available for use by allied agencies when available and appropriate.

Operational benefits of this equipment include faster and safer entry, reduced physical strain on personnel compared to manual breaching methods, improved precision with minimal structural damage, reduced noise compared to shotgun or explosive breaching options, and increased versatility for use in apartments, hotels, steel doors, porches, and other confined or limited-access environments.

Mr. Young,

On behalf of Sheriff Matthew Crisafulli, the Sheriff's Office respectfully requests approval of an over-expenditure in the FY26 budget in the amount of \$76,632.42 to allow the Worcester County Sheriff's Office to place an ammunition order necessary for operational and training use in FY27.

Historically, the Sheriff's Office has pre-ordered bulk ammunition prior to the start of the fiscal year to account for extended manufacturer and distributor lead times, which typically range from six (6) to seven (7) months, sometimes longer. Under this practice, ammunition was neither shipped nor billed until the start of the applicable fiscal year. We have been advised that placing such pre-orders during the current fiscal year for a future fiscal-year need is not in compliance with County financial policy.

To ensure full compliance with County Government fiscal requirements and to avoid similar issues going forward, we are requesting approval of an over-expenditure in FY26 so the order may be placed appropriately at this time, in consideration of our operational and supply-chain realities from the distributor.

Public Works is requesting Commissioner approval to reduce the speed on Cathell Road from 40 mph to 35 mph. A resident reached out regarding speeding concerns on Cathell Road, in response Roads Division conducted a speed study which yielded the following results:

- Number of Vehicles: 8,996
- Average Speed: 39.4 mph
- 85th Percentile: 43.0 mph
- Vehicles >40 mph: 4003 or 44.5%

The study was conducted on January 7, 2026, thru January 12, 2026. A copy of the study is attached. Based on the speed study, road geometry, and adjacent residential homes, Public Works recommends this road be posted at 35 mph.

Our Department is requesting permission to move forward with a new pavilion at Stockton Park. The current pavilion is in poor shape and has exceeded its life span. Funding has been approved by Program Open Space in the amount of \$50,000. Expenditures will come out of 100.1602.500.6160.241- Grant Programs POS Park Development. The project is 90% reimbursable. Below are two options for your consideration:

Option A: Purchase and have installed a new 16' by 30' steel frame Pavilion. These services have been quoted by All Recreation of Virginia Inc. through their cooperative contract with GOVMVMT resulting in savings of \$751.36. The proposed contract also includes new PVC coated picnic tables to match the new structure. The total contract amount including installation is \$46,000. GOVMVMT is a cooperative purchasing organization that combines the purchasing power of public agencies from across the country into contracts that are competitively solicited, evaluated, and awarded by a lead public agency. GOVMVMT contracts follow the competitive contracting law process to solicit, evaluate, and award cooperative purchasing contracts for goods and services.

Option B: Contract Pole Buildings unlimited to stick build a 16' by 30' wood frame pavilion. Total contract price is \$18,779. Pricing includes all drawings, permits, materials and installation, however, the pricing does not include any picnic tables. Please see the attached quote for additional details.

Our Department has reached out to several other vendors for pricing and we believe these are the two best options for your consideration. Option A provides an increased projected longevity due to the materials used for construction and helps reduce graffiti, maintenance, and possible combustion. Option B offers significant cost savings due to the materials being used.

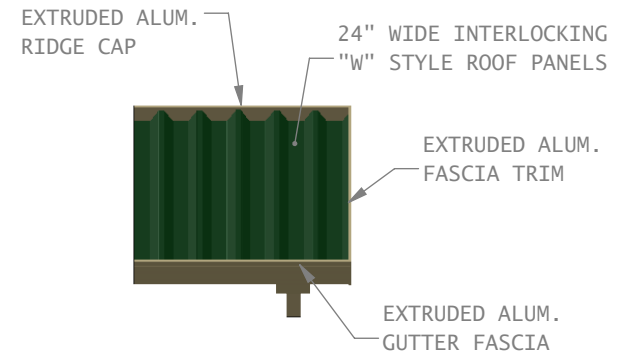
