The following questions and answers are provided as a matter of information to clarify issues raised about the Bid Documents.

Item	Questions and Answers
	Is water based traffic paint acceptable for the line stripping? What width do you want, 4" or 5"?
	Water based paint is fine and 5" lines.
	The Details 1-4, some streets are spelled out the specs but others are not. Can you clarify which Detail you are looking for?.
	The detail portion of the spreadsheet looks like it got cut off on the posting so we are attached it again that shows the details for each road.
	West Second Street states 2,112 linear feet however on site measurements are 220 linear feet and 440 tons. Can you clarify if I am missing something or if this was a typo.
	Correct, it is a typo, length is 211', total tons is 44 tons.
	Milling is only specified for certain streets, however there are parking lots and driveways that tie into the street. Will milling be required to provide a smooth transition? To what extent?

	<p>Parking lots and driveway milling are considered incidental and not additional work. Milling of driveways and parking lots will be needed to ensure a smooth transition and positive drainage is achieved with the final product.</p>
	<p>.Is it the contractor's responsibility to advertise pending road work? Or will the County handle advertisements to inform homeowners and business owners of possible street closures? County will handle advertising, but contractor may need to go door to door in some circumstances.</p>
	<p>Is any backfill required on unsupported edges after overlay? County will handle backfilling the shoulders after paving is completed.</p>
	<p>Is the contractor required to raise any in street utilities such as manholes or valve boxes? If so will the contractor provide the necessary risers or will the county provide them? If raising utilities is needed, the contractor will supply the needed risers.</p>
