

**WORCESTER COUNTY ELECTRICAL BOARD  
MEETING MINUTES  
April 11, 2017**

The Worcester County Electrical Board met on Tuesday, April 11, 2017 in the meeting room of the Isle of Wight County Office Building, 13070 St. Martin's Neck Road, Bishopville, Maryland. Members present were Kenneth Lambertson Sr., Chairman, Jeffrey Novak, Duane Duncan, Roy Case, Michael Patchett and Steve Kolarik, Members. Also in attendance were Deborah Mooney, License Permit Clerk II, and Ed Tudor, Director of the Department of Development Review & Permitting (DRP).

The meeting was called to order by Kenneth Lambertson, Sr., Chairman, at 3:25P.M.

The minutes of the last meeting held on March 14, 2017 and the agenda for this meeting were reviewed. A motion was made by Michael Patchett, seconded by Duane Duncan, and unanimously carried to approve the minutes, as presented.

The following is the Treasurer's Report to be included in the minutes:

The Treasurer's Report for March: the Department issued (69) electrical permits, total revenue collected for electrical permits was \$1725.00. Four (4) new Master Electrician Licenses was issued to Michael Kurek, Michael Flammia, Christopher Herm and Henry Hom Jr. all four reciprocated with the State of Maryland. The total revenue collected for electrical licenses was \$400.00. Total revenue for the month of January was \$2,125.00.

The Board after reviewing agenda, prior minutes and treasurer's report continued the meeting with the discussion of the email that the Board received from the director of Maryland Codes Administration in regards to the potential danger in solar tie in to utility panel. After reviewing and discussing the email a motion was made by Mike Patchett and seconded by Jeffrey Novak, and unanimously carried to continue to enforce the code as it currently is.

The next item of business was to review the proposed bill to eliminate homeowners electrical permits. Ed Tudor presented a revised bill that explained more clearly when an electrical permit needs to be issued and why a licensed electrician should have to pull the permit. A motion was made by Steve Kolarik and seconded by Duane Duncan and unanimously carried to present the revised bill to the County Commissioners for approval.

Next, the Board discussed letting Michael Savage an inspector who had let his license lapse to be able to shelve his license. A motion was made by Jeffrey Novak and seconded by Roy Case and unanimously carried to allow Mr. Savage to shelve his license with the proper paperwork.

Next, the Board reviewed the application for John Dize Jr. to take the electrician general exam. A motion was made by Roy Case and seconded by Steve Kolarik and unanimously carried to let Mr. Dize Jr. take the electrician general exam. In reviewing Mr. Dize Jr. application the Board felt he was qualified to take the master electrician exam as well. The Board told Debbie Mooney to suggest the thought of instead of taking the electrician general exam that he is qualified to take the master electrician exam if he

would like to. A motion was made by Roy Case and seconded by Jeffrey Novak and unanimously carried to approve Mr. Dize Jr. to take the master electrician exam if he chooses.

**A motion was made by Steve Kolarik, seconded by Duane Duncan and unanimously carried to adjourn the meeting at 4:05 P.M.**
